

The University of Auckland is a public university located in Auckland, New Zealand. Established in 1883, it is ranked 1st in New Zealand and 81st in the world for university rankings. Auckland accepts IB and A Level qualifications, and international students may apply for any of the courses the university offers. Some of the undergraduate courses include: business analytics, communication, law, software engineering, etc. Fees vary depending on the course. For example, the bachelor of medicine and surgery course offered charges \$54,000 per year for international students.

What does a veterinarian do?

As a veterinarian, you are expected to know how to treat, diagnose, perform surgeries and identify diseases in animals. In addition, advising owners on animals feeding and behavior plays a very important role in this


Education Requirements:

- Subjects you should enjoy: biology, chemistry and physics.
- Before applying to universities, work experience is required
- Courses for university should be: medicine or veterinary science degree

Skills required

- Compassion- medicine is not an easy job, so you must be able to have the strength to treat animals, as well as feeling empathy towards them. This means that you should be able to create a connection with the sick or injured animals to let them trust you.
- Decision-making- It is important to be confident when making decisions upon the disease or illness of the animals that you treat. This skill is acquired through years of studying.
- Communication talking with the pets' owners is a very important skill, as you have to explain each step of the treatment and advise them on behaviours or how to feed their pets.
- Observational unlike humans, animals can't express their emotions, so a veterinarian must be able to observe and recognize behavior patterns that may give them hints on what treatment animals should be given.
- Technical accuracy in diagnostics is now based on high-quality machinery, so a vet should feel confident and comfortable in using the equipment to make sure they have accurate results. The machinery is also useful in painting medical records for the clients.

Studying during



- Plan your day so you can have enough time to do your coursework/homework, study, and prayer efficiently.
- **Rest** make sure that you get at least 8 hours of sleep at night or try to take shorter naps during the day.
- **Daily exercise** this is extremely important for your body so try to go on a walk/run/cycle but, if you cannot go outside then try doing simple stretches or yoga at home.
- Mental health & wellbeing do not stress yourself because of school/exams. If you do feel overwhelmed try to slow down and talk to your friends and family but if you need some assistance then contact our school's counsellor.

University News



Researchers at ETH-Zurich have used computer simulations to show that climate change is having a profound impact on the state of rivers worldwide. This is largely in part due to the fact that climate change contributes massively to the ever-changing global water levels, which in turn can influence the amount of water in rivers and the likelihood of flooding or drought. The importance of rivers for irrigation and electricity generation means that this unpredictability could be devastating for populations in all corners of the world. Furthermore, the researchers modelled the same simulation if climate change was not as significant, and found that the "observed changes are highly unlikely without climate

change." The collaborative effort with support from institutes across 12 different countries shows that man-made greenhouse-gas emissions continue to have a significant impact on every aspect of the world around us.

How to succeed as a sixth form student

- 1. Be on top of your work this means more than finishing your homework, you should always revise, even if it's just 15 minutes per day. There is a lot of content for each subject, so as a student, you should make sure to revise all the content taught to you in order to ace your exams.
- 2. Be sure you like the subjects you have chosen compared to IGCSE, the subjects will be narrowed down, so picking a subject that you don't enjoy that you will have almost every day will bring you nothing but stress.

 Choose for yourself!
- 3. Go to the career guidance counselor frequently figuring out what you want to do in the future is stressful, but the career guidance counselors are there for you to help you understand what subjects to focus on, what country seems right for you, what course to take, and so on. This is your responsibility so go to them frequently!
- 4. Finish your CAS on time (for IB only) best option is to finish CAS before Year 13, so that you have time to focus on revising for your exams and finish your extended essay. Remember, CAS is a pass or fail!

Scholarship of the month

The Turkish Government offers the Turkiye Scholarship to students of all nationalities looking to study in Turkey. The scholarship runs for undergraduate, postgraduate and PhD programs in participating universities, with full tuition coverage, accommodation fees and a 1-year Turkish language course provided among other things. Students applying for the scholarship will have to demonstrate strong academic achievement as well as attend an interview should they be shortlisted for the scholarship. The registration window has closed for 2021, but for 2022 applicants the window reopens between the 10th of January and the 20th of February.
