Year 1: We will be learning how to tell the time.

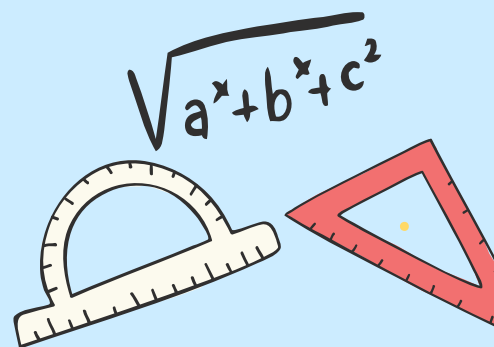
Year 2: This week we will focus on Place Value.

Year 6: Children will be participating in a project, working in teams to solve a problem.

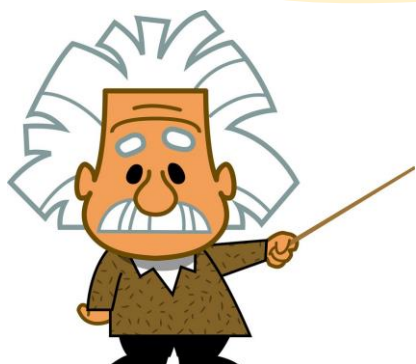

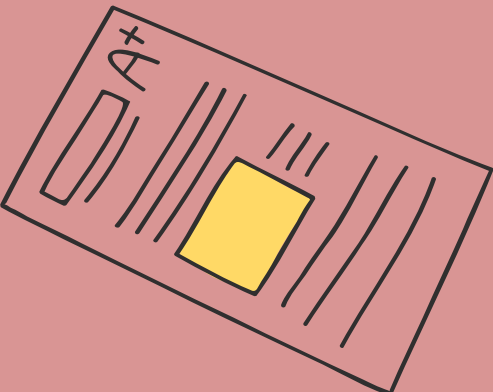
