Dear Parents,

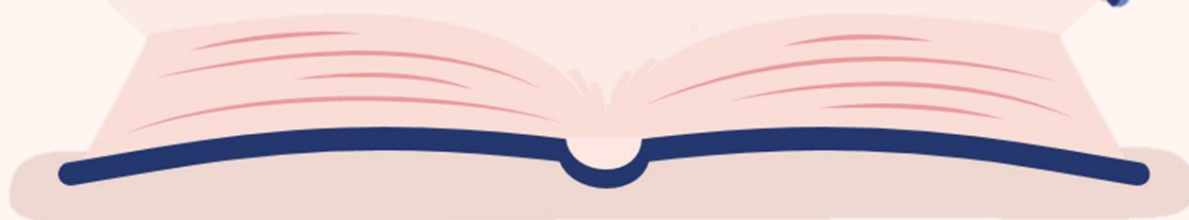

Year 2: This week we will explore vocabulary from the Vehicle text.

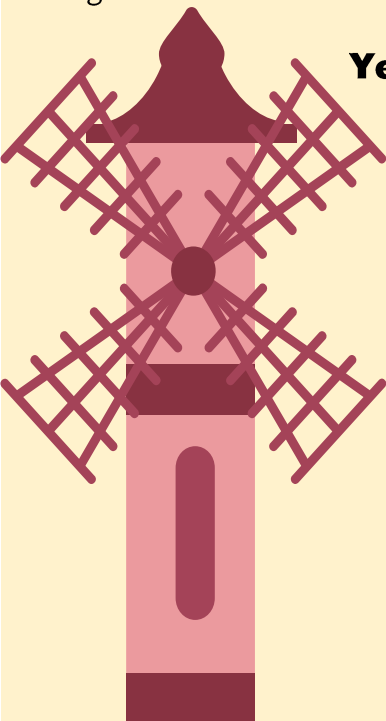
Year 3: In writing we will be looking at our new text 'Into the Forest', familiarising ourselves with the new vocabulary and looking at direct/indirect speech.
