

## MESSAGE FROM JORDAN DAVIES (HEAD OF PRIMARY)

Dear Parents,

I hope you have had a good 5 weeks and are keeping mentally and physically healthy at this time. In line with the Ministry of Public Health's announcement yesterday, we expect our blended model to continue after the half-term break. However, as a precautionary measure, I have asked teachers to send home exercise books for reading, writing and maths (Year 1-Year 6 children only). Some year groups may also send items like a whiteboard and pen home. These resources are to aid with your child's learning, if further restrictions happen during the half-term break. Please look after all equipment and return it to school after the half-term break. I would like to emphasise again that this is a precautionary measure.

### LITERACY:

**Year 2:** We continue with Division. Group equally.

**Year 3:** We will be continue and complete our work on lenth and perimetre.

**Year 4:** We will explore the link between fractions and multiplication and division.

**Year 5:** Pupils will continue developing their understanding of Fractions.

**Year 6:** We will be finishing off our percentages unit by comparing them to fractions and decimals.
