PRIMARY WEEKLY BRIEF

Week Commencing the 19th and 23rd of May 2021

LITERACY:

Year 1: We will be planning and writing our own return stories.

Year 2: The children will be completing their 'hot task' where they independently research and write another report about a different rainforest animal of their choice.

Year 3: In writing we will be completing our unit based on the text 'Egyptology'. Children will use their plans to write their own story. In reading we will be continuing to read 'Tilly and the Time Machine'. This week we will be focussing on the Retrieval Viper.

Year 4: This week the children will be writing and editing their diary entry.

Year 5: The children will write their narratives and edit and improve their work through reflection and feedback.

Year 6: We will complete our final hot write of the balanced argument we have been working on. In reading children will continue reading 'Can you see me?' and answering questions based on the text.

MATHS:

Year 1: We will be looking at fractions.

Year 2: This week we will count in fractions.

Year 3: This week we will be starting a new unit looking at time.

Year 4: Children will be revisiting bar charts and collecting data to create a bar chart.

Year 5: Children will order and sequence decimal numbers showing an understanding of place value.

Year 6: Children will be exploring Mathematical puzzles and investigations.
