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LITERACY:

Year 1: We will be writing a letter to Hermelin.

Year 2: We will be continuing examining and exploring the text of The 'Bog Baby' and finding the meaning of new vocabulary.

Year 3: In writing we will be continuing to look at return narratives. This week they will be gathering ideas and planning their own stories.

We will be continuing with 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory' in reading. This week we will be focussing on the Explain Viper.

Year 4: This week in English children will research and continue to plan their instructional text.

Year 5: Pupils will begin the planning and writing stage of their writing of a biography. In Guided Reading, children will continue to read their new class novel 'The Magnificent Seven' and learn the VIPERS skills.

Year 6: Next week in English we will be beginning to research our Human Rights Issue and plan our letter.

In Reading children will continue their guided reading sessions on the text 'Room 13'.

MATHS:

Year 1: We will be doing number bonds within 10.

Year 2: We will be starting with Division, (Making equal groups).

Year 3: This will be the last week of our multiplication and division unit. Children will be recapping the bus stop method for division, journalling and ending with a post unit assessment.

Year 4: We will focus on division of 1 digit by 3 digit numbers. The bus stop method will be used.

Year 5: Pupils will be learning about equivalent fractions.

Year 6: Next week we will be finishing our unit on decimals by converting fractions to decimals and beginning to look at percentages.
