A Level Chemistry



As part of the Chemistry International A-level, students are expected to carry out and understand experimental work linked to the theory they are studying. This is the first experiment of the AS course and involves measuring the amount of gases produced during a chemical reaction, and using that to calculate the amounts of different unknown substances. Mrs Goggin's Year 13 IB Biology students have been modelling their knowledge of natural selection through the demonstration of competitive feeding strategies in finches. It was a great way for the students to get hands on experience of the most effective way of feeding. 

Mental Health Awareness Week






Last week's library lessons focused on Mental Health Awareness. The main idea was to promote the message of good mental health and to make our students aware of issues related to mental health.
