House Competitions




Last week was an amazing week for the Yellow Falcons who earned a massive 2448 house points.




Year 12 English

Mrs Salonga's Year 13 ESS students have been working on an awareness campaign about food waste as part of their lesson on soil and food production systems.










Virtual ECA'S Cycling Club

Psychology Week has included:

- **Day 1-** Positive light footprint: The students choose a word that makes you feel empowered and makes you love, appreciate and honor yourself.
- Day 2- coping cards:: The students will look at their possibilities, hopes, goals or behaviors that can inspire them with the power of what is possible, thereby, effecting positive change in their life. They will write a note to themselves, reminding them of what they can achieve.
- Day 3- Debate, with one of the questions being; 'Can the world survive without men?'
- Day 4- The power of possibility bookmark: on a bookmark, the students had to come up with a word or quote that will help direct towards what is possible, or what is impossible that you wish to make possible.
