


HOUSE COMPETITIONS

YOUNG GEOGRAPHER OF THE YEAR COMPETITION

For the last week of this term, the Humanities department is hosting the "Young Geographer of the Year Competition 2021" whereby students should create an annotated map based on how Covid-19 has shaped their lives. Some features should include: which local human and physical features the student and their family used during the pandemic, why some places were really important to them, Places they could not visit and why, Anywhere the pandemic led them to visiting or using a new place.



KS3 should submit: A map with a description of four or more geographical features with annotated images and diagrams.

KS4 should submit: A map with a description of six or more geographical features with annotated images and diagrams.

KS5 should submit: A map with a description of multiple geographical features with a strong use of annotated images, diagrams and data.
