Message from the Head of Secondary Darren Atkinson

In particular, since the return to 100%, the school has been alive with lessons, assemblies, sporting activities, curriculum programmes, musical performances and so much more. As an educator, there is nothing more fulfilling then walking the corridors of a great school and observing all the fantastic learning that is taking place.

One of our many objectives for the year was to have a successful BSO (British Schools Overseas) Inspection that highlighted the great work we do here in Secondary, and also provide an opportunity to show off some of the plans we had for the next few years. 
