House Competitions




The first week back after the spring break sees the Purple Camels still holding on to their lead with a massive 4084 house points earned in one week!


The overall standings saw the Green Scorpions reclaim second spot, taking over the Yellow Falcons.

She came second in the Youth 12-13 (female) category. Well done Shu Hui, everyone at DBS is extremely proud of you.








Library Poetry Corner






...and the brother of someone with Autism Spectrum (ASD) needs...



She's two years older than me and I realised when I had to go to [mainstream] school and she didn't. She did well in Special School, but the provision really goes up to 18 in the UK and then what's next? It's worth talking about how adults with ASD can be supported to integrate into wider society.

My sister is terrified of dogs, I mean really terrified. My parents dealt with [the challenges of her condition] by saying that I must include her in my friendship groups - which didn't go down too well as a teenager. It's hard to see, even now as an adult, how debilitating the condition can be as my sister wants to be able to do the things I do, but can't: having a friendship group, a family, etc. I must add, though, that not loving her was not an option. She is my sister and that's that.

Growing up we had some funny moments: the fact that she can make up 20 different storylines when only one is on the telly and the fact that Fairy liquid will never fully rinse off our glasses as long as she is cleaning up [is hilarious] but that's just her.

My advice to anyone with a sibling who has ASD, is... it's not a big deal. Are they still the same person you always knew? Yes. Then it's just a label and really no problem at all. I always say to others who ask, no matter how hard it must be for you, it's harder for them.



...and the aunt of someone with Autism Spectrum (ASD) needs...



He is my sister's third child, so cute and as an infant, he loved watching commercials. We realised quickly that he wasn't paying attention and was in his 'own little world'. My sister was always very patient, taking him for hearing tests and Speech and Language therapy to help him speak. Eventually, he was diagnosed.

He is 20 now and the best thing my sister did was to make the entire family aware of his needs so we could be involved in supporting him with learning social cues or playing the guitar for his school performances. In the past, he has flooded the bathroom with bubbles! Because he follows structures so well, though, my sister even says "I can depend on him more than the others!" I've noticed progress over the years; he used to be at a distance, and now comes over for sleepovers.
