It is also a great way for students to develop 3D thinking skills, spatial awareness, scale and material manipulation skills!






Year 12 Biology


From here they will go on to create testable specifications linked closely to their research, and begin their design ideas.

They won their group to progress to the semi finals and then beating Park House in the final to take Gold!



Remember it's ok not to be ok, if you are struggling please speak to someone, a friend, family member, teacher, house leader, we are all here to help.




