Well done to everyone who was involved and a huge congratulations to everyone who was selected to represent their tutor groups. We look forward to seeing you work together throughout the year.






School Attendance




As part of our push on improving attendance this year, we will have a monthly attendance update by year group and house for KS3 and 4.

Year 7 are leading the way, with attendance total for September of 96.5%. Year 8 are hot on their tails with 95.5%, and Year 9 on 95.1%. Year 11 need to work hard to reach the 95% target, where they are currently on 94.7%, but Year 10 should have a big push on their attendance - currently bringing up the rear with 93.3% attendance - you can do better than this, Year 10! Parents, 10 please give your Year students a big push.



Falcons are flying high in terms of whole house attendance, with a huge 96.6%, although Scorpions are trying to claw their way into the lead with a 95.8% attendance. These two galloping ahead of the Horses and Camels, who are tied on 94.3%, coming in just an Oryx horn's width ahead of the Oryxes themselves, who are slightly behind on 94.1%. A big push is needed for those three to catch the early leaders!

This week it was wonderful to see some audience participation, with students volunteering to act out a scene on being a good friend. Well done to everyone involved.






Year 10 Graphics Fragrance Packaging

House Competitions








Extra Curricular Activities

Congratulations boys you have done an amazing job of representing DBS.


