LITERACY

Year 1: This week, we will be exploring our new class story 'Old Bear.'

Year 2: We will begin to read 'The Bog Baby' by Jeanne Willis and will write a character description.

Year 3: This week children will be exploring the vocabulary and images from our vehicle text "Rhythm of the Rain".

Year 4: This week, children will be immersed into our next text, 'Arthur and the Golden Rope'. They will also learn about expanded noun phrases and how to use them effectively in their writing.

Year 5: This week in writing we will use our 5 senses to help us write a setting description.

Year 6: The children will be writing a setting description based on the Weddell Sea from Shaklenton's Journey.

NUMERACY

Year 1: This week, we will be sorting objects within 10 into groups.

Year 2: This week's focus will be to partition numbers and write numbers in words to a 100.

Year 3: This week children will continue with place value. They will learn how to flexibly partition numbers up to and including 100.

Year 4: This week, children will be representing numbers up to 1000 on a number line. They will also be representing numbers up to 10,000 using base 10 and place value counters.

Year 5: This week children will be focusing on representing numbers up to 1,000,000.

Year 6: The children will be continuing their learning on Place Value including comparing and ordering numbers, rounding and negative numbers.

Last year was DBS Primary's most successful haul of medals in the Qatar Primary Private Schools Sports Association (QPPSSA) and we hope to better that this year. Please look out for notices here and via email about ECAs, squad trials and training for specific sports, swimming later in the year and the return of Kick Start Kilometre this term.

We are encouraging all pupils to "Be respectful, be ready & be safe" for PE lessons this year and I welcome your support on this from home. In order to do that we must send children into school ready for their PE lesson. This involves having had breakfast, bringing a water bottle and importantly wearing the correct kit. This includes DBS PE Kit, white socks and trainers (different to those shoes worn on non PE days). Children should also not be wearing any sort of jewellery; this includes earrings of any kind, necklaces, bracelets or rings. They should also not be wearing a watch and ensure that all long hair is tied up for PE lessons.
