To Do List

LITERACY

Year 1: This week, we will be identifying characters' feelings from our book 'Old Bear' and begin to explore nouns.

Year 2: This week, we will begin to describe a setting and develop our vocabulary using our book.

Year 3: This week children will begin to analyze the key phrases and vocabulary from our text "Rhythm of the Rain".

Year 4: This week, children will be looking at key vocabulary and phrases from our book 'Arthur and the Golden Rope'. They will also be writing a free verse poem using prepositional phrases.

Year 5: Children will begin to use relative clauses in their writing and edit their work.

Year 6: Children will be finding grammatical features and analysing our example text.

NUMERACY

Year 1: This week, we will be counting numbers to 10 through different representations, including number words.

Year 2: This week's focus will be to write numbers in expanded form to 100.

Year 3: This week children will learn mental methods such as flexibly partitioning numbers up to and including 100.

Year 4: This week children will be finding 1,10,100 and 1000 more/less than a number. They will also be comparing and ordering numbers up to 10,000.

Year 5: Children will be rounding numbers to 10, 100, 1000 and 10,000.

Year 6: Children will be starting their new topic of the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division).



Music

KS2 Choir notice: I am pleased to confirm that KS2 Choir will begin on Wednesday 20th September in the Primary Music Room. Choir will run from immediately after school at 2.00pm - 3.00pm. Please note that nearer choir festival events and the Qatar Choir of the Year Competition rehearsal times will be extended and all are expected to participate if they are to take part.

All Choir members from last year are automatically guaranteed a place. Please let me know in advance if your child no longer wishes to be a member. Any pupils who wish to join the choir need to come and see me prior to Wednesday 20th September for a brief voice test individually. Pupils should mostly be able to sing in tune.

Reception students got to meet his/her new Spanish teacher and engage in fun activities and songs about colours.

- Y1 students will start learning colors in Spanish
- Y2 students will continue learning about classroom instructions and equipment.
- Y3 students are learning about tricky sounds and how to pronounce them
- Y4 students are learning about sports and how to form phrases using the verb sugar
- Y5 students are revising numbers up to 100.
- Y6 students have just started to practice tricky sounds and how to pronounce them.
