
This week children will be counting in.

Reception

- Reception students are taught colours and how to use them to describe their surroundings. They can now recall a few of them on demand.
- Y1 Students are learning about colour and putting a lot of effort into improving their writing in Spanish.
- Y2 Students are able to explain the contents of their pencil case.

 They can now use a variety of terminology to construct a lengthy paragraph.
- Y3 Students have been reading a comic strip and responding to challenging questions about it.
- Y4 Students are now able to express their opinions on the sports they enjoy and why. To be efficient, this necessitates extensive grammatical understanding.
- Y5 Students are studying. They are currently proficient with the o'clock, quarter past, and half past.
 - Students are looking into present simple tenses. They are effectively creating complete sentences from nothing using previously taught patterns.
