Dear Parents,

Finally, our weekly learning tip 7 will look at the use of Concrete Examples:

Concrete examples are used frequently by all our teachers. Concrete information is easier to remember than abstract information, and so concrete examples foster learning. Importantly, research shows that multiple examples of the same idea, especially with different surface details, helps students understand the true idea the example is intending to illustrate. This is because novices tend to remember surface details. Imagine teaching about scarcity and using airline tickets as an example. Students later may remember scarcity was about flying, but not the rest. Using other examples that have nothing to do with tickets (e.g., water during a drought) and making the link between the examples explicit for the students helps them understand the underlying abstract idea.

I'm Alaa Aly and I am currently in Year 13, completing my IB diploma final year. Choosing the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme meant I would complete an academic essay on any subject of my choice. This 4000 word essay gave me the chance to explore my favourite subject, delve into topics I enjoy, and pick up more

knowledge for a better understanding.

I chose History as my subject, specifically the topic of Communist China and my question is:

"To what extent did Mao Zedong's leadership contribute to the success of the Communist revolution in China?"

The Extended Essay must adhere to the IB guidelines, including word count restrictions and proper citation methods, as these factors are taken into account during the assessment process. Each student undergoing their Extended Essay component is paired up with a subject-specific supervisor at DBS. We have three reflective meetings to discuss the research process and the skills developed during the writing of the essay.

The process of completing the IB Extended Essay has proven to be an immensely enriching experience, moulding my academic journey into further education. Beyond the confines of the classroom, the Extended Essay has emerged as a journey of self-discovery, empowering me to take charge of my learning and kindling a passion for independent learning. No doubt, this experience has got me ready for the challenges of higher education. I will be stepping into my next academic pursuits with the confidence that the IB Extended Essay has me well-prepped for the journey ahead.


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TRAFFIC AWARENESS AT DBS AIN KHALED

- **Stop in a safe area:** Do not stop or unload passengers in the middle of the road. This can create dangerous situations.
- **No Overtaking:** Refrain from overtaking into oncoming traffic. Everyone is waiting their turn, and patience is vital for safety.
- **Seatbelts:** Ensure that all children wear their seatbelts correctly in the car. Seatbelts are essential for their safety.
- Speed Limit: All drivers should maintain a maximum speed of 30 KPH near the school. Slower speeds greatly enhance safety.
- **Slow Driving:** Drive very slowly around the school, especially during peak drop-off and pick-up hours.
- Crossing the Road: Please ensure that children are encouraged to look both left and right for traffic when crossing the road and all Primary students to hold hands with an older sibling, parent, family member, nanny or driver.
- Supporting Security: Please cooperate with the security and senior staff as they manage traffic flow. Their guidance is crucial for the safety of everyone.
- **Kindness and Respect:** Please be kind and respectful to fellow drivers and DBS staff. Keeping children safe is of the utmost importance.
