Dear Parents,

This has been an amazing week of learning at DBS Ain Khaled, where the curiosity of our students and intellectual inquiry never ceases to amaze me even after 33 years of teaching across the world. Some examples of student questions I have been asked this week to help convey this sense of critical thinking and intellectual capital includes:

- Why is sleep so important to the way we learn and remember? (Two Sixth Form Students)
- How can we be certain of anything if the world is constantly changing, and technology and AI is evolving so quickly? (One of our Year 13 IB Students)
- What is happiness and how do we even know we are happy (Year 8 student)

We are also delighted to be hosting our very first Parent Workshop next Wednesday, October 11th, 5-6pm in the MPH. In conjunction with our colleagues in Friends of DBS, we are co-hosting and organising this event on the basis of your requests so we hope you can attend and support our community. This event will highlight key developmental stages at Primary and Secondary Phases, combining theory with practical examples and strategies to manage and better understand the complexities of behaviors at such formative years of development. It will be facilitated by Dr Luke Cheater (Head of Primary) and Mr. Mark Healy (Head of Secondary) and we hope to foster dialogue with you all in order to gain valuable insights that will help support our students navigate their DBS journey at home and school. We also want to build upon and continue to foster a supportive environment and community spirit here at DBS, Ain Khaled. We look forward to the company of everyone and hope some fascinating and thought provoking dialogue ensues.

Finally, our fourth weekly Learning Tip will focus on the benefits of elaborative Interrogation:

Elaboration is a really broad concept- at its core, it just means connecting or adding information. "Elaborative interrogation" is a strategy within this broad idea, and it involves asking how" and "why" questions and finding those answers (1) Students can do this independently, with the teacher helping, or in pairs of groups. Once they come up with the questions, students must also find the answers!

For example, how much you learn about the physics of flying? You could do it by answering lots of fact- based questions, but you can also supplement this y asking and then answering elaboration questions, such as "why does a plane need an engine?" and "how does a plane take off?"

CAS (Creativity, Activity, Service):

It's all about sparking creativity, staying active, and giving back to the community, stressing the need for a well-rounded education that goes beyond just books and classes.

EE (Extended Essay):

You get to dive deep into a topic you love with a 4,000-word independent research project, honing your research and writing skills along the way.

TOK (Theory of Knowledge):


It's all about digging into how we know the things we do and encouraging you to think critically and reflect on it.



Reem Ahmed from 70 is the first Reader of the Month (for the month of September)



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


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TRAFFIC AWARENESS AT DBS AIN KHALED

- **Stop in a safe area:** Do not stop or unload passengers in the middle of the road. This can create dangerous situations.
- **No Overtaking:** Refrain from overtaking into oncoming traffic. Everyone is waiting their turn, and patience is vital for safety.
- **Seatbelts:** Ensure that all children wear their seatbelts correctly in the car. Seatbelts are essential for their safety.
- **Speed Limit:** All drivers should maintain a maximum speed of 30 KPH near the school. Slower speeds greatly enhance safety.
- **Slow Driving:** Drive very slowly around the school, especially during peak drop-off and pick-up hours.
- Crossing the Road: Please ensure that children are encouraged to look both left and right for traffic when crossing the road and all Primary students to hold hands with an older sibling, parent, family member, nanny or driver.
- **Supporting Security:** Please cooperate with the security and senior staff as they manage traffic flow. Their guidance is crucial for the safety of everyone.
- **Kindness and Respect:** Please be kind and respectful to fellow drivers and DBS staff. Keeping children safe is of the utmost importance.
