

students university applications and offers

Over the past five months, the Sixth form careers department has been extremely busy preparing for international applications and deadlines. We are thrilled to discover that students have begun to receive offers and scholarships from some of the world's most famous colleges, and we look forward to hearing more success stories from the remainder of the student cohort in January. We have welcomed over 50 university admissions recruiters to our campus to obtain a greater knowledge of the programmes they offer and their entry requirements, and to propose ways to streamline the application process for our students.



Up to the present moment, 16 sixth form students have applied for medicine and Early Decision programmes in the United Kingdom, the United States and Qatar. In addition, 94 A-Level, IB, and AS students are finalising their documents for submission to some of the world's most prestigious institutions in the United Kingdom, Canada, the United States, Qatar, Ireland, the Netherlands, and Europe. Students have selected careers in a variety of fields, including Aerospace Engineering, International Business Management, Computer Science, Psychology, Dentistry, and Law.

This week it was brought to the attention of the careers team that one student in particular has applied for 10 United States universities. This student has currently received 9 conditional offers, some include scholarship awards and awaiting the completion of an interview to potentially result in receiving offers to all 10 of the prospective universities. 
