#### Key Details for the Use of Yondr Pouches at DBS

- Implementation of the Yondr Pouches will commence in Term 2 2025. Every Secondary school student will have the opportunity to purchase a Yondr Pouch.
- Students without a Yondr pouch will be required to leave their mobile phones at home.
- Students found in possession of mobile phones at school and who are not using a Yondr Pouch will have the device confiscated.
- A dedicated phone line is available at the school reception for students to make any emergency phone calls.
- The BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) policy encourages students to use their own tablets or laptops for educational purposes. These devices must be registered with the school's IT department. The



### **ABDULLA'S COMMITMENT TO** ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE


