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## ENGLISH:

### EYFS:

**Preschool:** We will be exploring the book 'Oliver's Vegetables', discussing what foods we like and dislike and learning about healthy eating.

**Reception:** We will be reading the book 'Oliver's Vegetables'. We will be exploring the vegetables we like and dislike. We will also be identifying healthy and unhealthy foods and why it is important to eat healthily.

### KS1:

**Year 1/2:** This week the children will be exploring adjectives through the story of 'The Gruffalo'. The children will be writing character descriptions.

### KS2:

**Year 3/4:** We will be looking at using conjunctions and becoming familiar with new vocabulary to use within our 'Threat Narrative'.

**Year 5/6:** We will be looking to apply our work this week on adverbial phrases in context with our writing unit - creating a character narrative based on 'The Promise'.



## MATHS:

### EYFS:

**Preschool:** We are continuing to explore numbers to 5 and encouraging children to count with 1:1 correspondence (1 number name to each object).

**Reception:** We will be ordering numbers from 1-10 and continuing to explore patterns.

### KS1:

**Year 1/2:** This week the Year 1 children will continue to look at one more and one less. The Year 2 children will continue with place value, exploring and representing numbers to 100.

### KS2:

**Year 3/4:** We will be counting in 50s and 25s and beginning to understand how to round to the nearest 10, 100, 1000.

**Year 5/6:** We will be continuing our work on the 4 operations, with a particular emphasis on long multiplication and short division.

Year 5/6: We will be looking to apply the previous work on our Spanish passport.



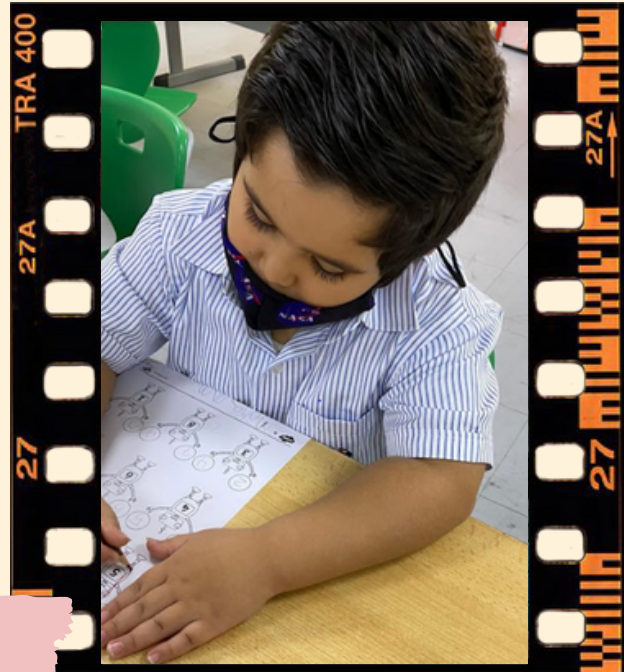
