#### Welcome to Secondary Handbook

Before the start of this academic year, our admissions office sent a copy of the welcome to the secondary information pack and has been sending it out to parents who joined after the start of the academic year. In case you did not receive the information pack previously, please find below the link to the document, it contains important information regarding communication procedures, student absences, visiting the site amongst other things. #### **Absence Procedures**

As we progress through the academic year, it is inevitable that there will be occasions when children feel unwell and will be absent from school. Please see below guidance on steps to follow:

- If a student is unwell on any given day, the form tutor and reception must be notified of the absence

- For any Medical absences longer than two days, a medical note will be required for it to be marked as an authorised medical absence, all others may be classed as unauthorised.
- If a parent does not notify the school of the reason for the absence, on the day or the school does not authorize the absence it will be marked as unauthorized.
- All absence is recorded and it is a minimum requirement for students to attend 95% of school throughout the year.

If a student requests to be absent for any reason other than educational or medical then the school will need to be informed and must authorize the request. If a student's attendance is below 97% then any request for leave will not be approved.

# Parent Pass

If you have not yet applied for a parents pass, please do so as a matter of urgency.

It is vitally important that all parents and their nominated representatives have a Parent pass and that they wear it when they are on the campus. This will ensure that any adult on campus is there for legitimate reasons. This is particularly important during drop off and pick up.

Should you require more than one pass it will be 20 QAR for each extra pass.
