School day - Ramadan

It is currently expected that the first day of Ramadan will fall on Thursday, March 23rd; however, this date is yet to be confirmed. Starting from the first day of Ramadan, we will operate a shortened school day in accordance with the Ministry of Education's recommendation. Consequently, the following changes will be made to the day:

- School hours during Ramadan will be from 8:00 am to 1:00 pm.
- Students must not arrive at school before 7:45 am as there will be no supervision available.
- There will be no ECA program during Ramadan.
- During Ramadan, the school canteen will be closed. Students who are not fasting will need to bring their own food and snacks.
- Indoor areas will be allocated for break and lunchtime for students who are fasting.
- Students who are not fasting should only eat and drink in the canteen area.
- We will continue to follow the full curriculum program, but will modify some activities.

To enable our students to follow their regular timetable as closely as possible, we will reduce the length of each lesson from 50 minutes to 40 minutes and shorten the lunch break by 10 minutes. Please refer to the table below for the lesson timings.

In order to allow our students to follow as close as possible their normal timetable, we will need to reduce the length of each lesson from 50 minutes to 40 minutes and lunchtime will be reduced by 10 minutes.

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
Star of the Week









