#### **Garangao**

For those who, like me, are unfamiliar with it, Garangao is a traditional celebration observed during the month of Ramadan in certain countries of the Middle East, including Qatar, Bahrain, and some parts of Saudi Arabia. Typically, it falls on the 14th night of Ramadan, also known as the Night of the Full Moon.

During Garangao, children dress in traditional attire and visit homes in their neighborhood, singing songs and receiving sweets and small gifts from their neighbors. The sweets are usually collected in a special bag, known as a "garangao bag," that the children carry with them.

Garangao is a festive and joyous occasion that is deeply rooted in the culture and customs of the Arabian Peninsula. It is an opportunity for families and communities to come together and celebrate the holy month of Ramadan, while also passing down their traditions and customs to future generations.

As for myself, I was delighted to learn about yet another celebration and to continue broadening my knowledge and appreciation for the rich traditions of the countries in which I have been fortunate enough to visit or reside. Whilst students are at DBS, we aim to develop and instil the following values:


