
Our Mission: To prepare all pupils through a relevant, challenging curriculum and well-resourced facilities, to become lifelong learners contributing to a global community.

#### **Morning Drop off - Gate 4**

Over the past few months, we've maintained a continuous eye on the traffic patterns around the school during drop-off and pick-up times. Our observations have shown that, as we've all settled into a regular routine and especially when we've collaborated to enhance traffic flow at the two main intersections, the traffic generally moves quite smoothly.

In our ongoing efforts to further expedite the drop-off process, we'll be conducting a trial for the next couple of weeks, focusing on also having student drop-offs closer to gate 4. Starting from Sunday, November 12th, we will open gate 4, allowing parents to drive to the lower end of the road to drop off their children, who can then enter the school through the gate 4, student entrance

In addition, please note that Gate 4 should exclusively be utilised by parents who intend to drop off their children, and in such cases where the children can independently make their way to their classes. If parents need to accompany their children into the school, we kindly request that they continue to use Gate 2 for this purpose.



#### **Important Notice for Parent & Guardian Campus Access**



For the continued safety and security of our entire school community, from Sunday 5th November onwards, all parents, drivers, nannies, and guardians who need to enter the campus for child drop-off or pick-up must visibly wear the red parent lanyard.

Please ensure you have your lanyard displayed. Entry to the campus will not be permitted without it. If you do not have a lanyard, you can order one from the main reception desk after being signed in by security.

## Star of the Week


