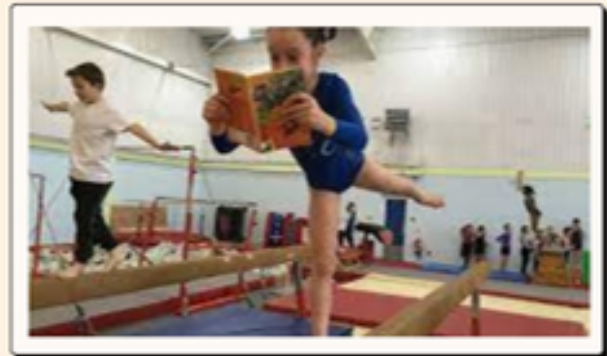
Decorate your item!

Children will have the opportunity to show off their costume in a costume catwalk / parade in school throughout the day!





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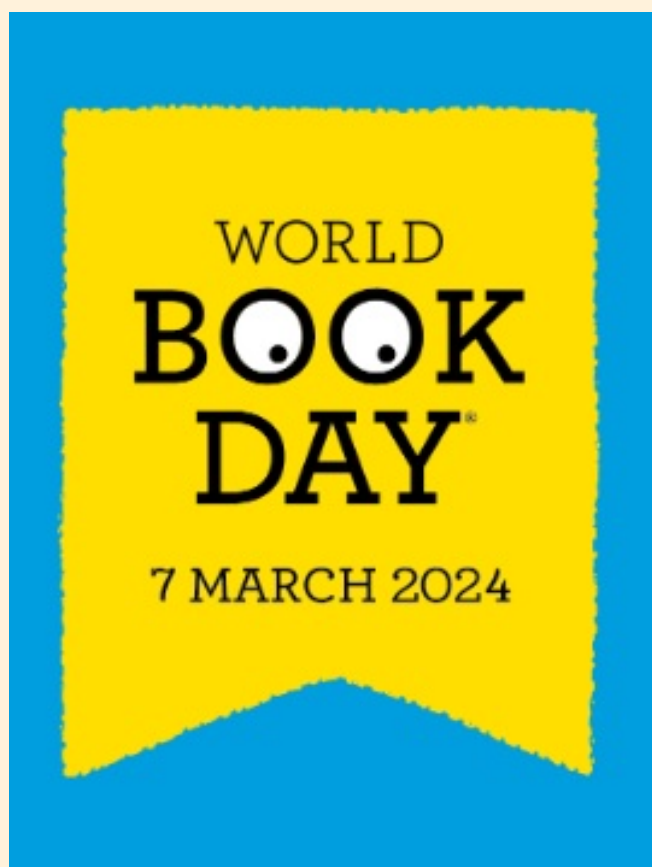

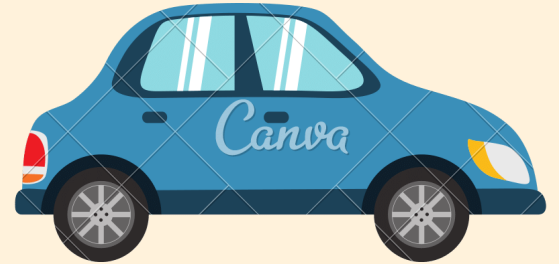
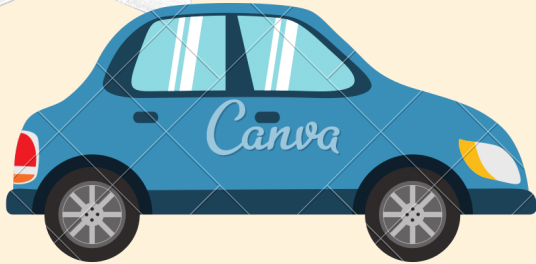


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We have been requested by the MOEHE to remind all parents of the importance of ensuring the safety and well-being of our children during pick-up and drop-off times.

Therefore, we kindly ask all parents to observe the following guidelines:

Adhere to Traffic Safety Laws: It is imperative to closely follow all traffic regulations. This not only ensures the safety of our children but also sets a strong example for them to follow in the future. Compliance with traffic laws reduces the risk of accidents and promotes a safer community for everyone.

Avoid Parking in Restricted Areas: Please refrain from parking your vehicles in front of entrances, exits, and the pavement. Doing so can create unnecessary hazards and impede the flow of traffic.

Do Not Block Traffic: Ensure that your vehicle does not stop in the middle of the road or in a place where it obstructs the flow of traffic.

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ENGLISH:



Preschool: We will be reading 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' as we continue our focus on sequencing and creating story maps.

Year 1: We will be story mapping and writing a narrative for 'The Incredible Book Eating Boy'.

Year 2: We will be story mapping and writing a narrative for 'The Incredible Book Eating Boy'.

Year 3: We will continue to immerse ourselves in our core texts for a non-fiction information report.

Year 4: We will begin the analysing stage of our text focusing on techniques of a persuasive letter.

Year 5: We will be immersing ourselves in a new text 'The Incredible Book Eating Boy' and writing our own narratives based on this ahead of World Book Day.

Year 6: We will be planning and delivering a presentation about all wolves.

MATHS:

Preschool: We will be continuing our learning on 3D and 2D shapes.

Reception: We will be exploring making arrangements of 10 and we will be consolidating our learning.

Year 1: We will be looking at ordering numbers to 50 using a numberline and counting one less and one more.

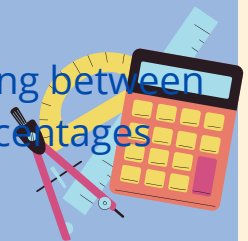
Year 2: We will be continue to explore different fractions, looking at thirds and quarters.

Year 3: We will continue to explore formal methods of multiplication and division.

Year 4: We will conclude our multiplication and division topic and begin exploring fractions.

Year 5: We will be learning how to multiply fractions by whole numbers.

Year 6: We will continue working on intensifiers combined with new adjectives

Year 3: We are learning about traditional Chinese music.

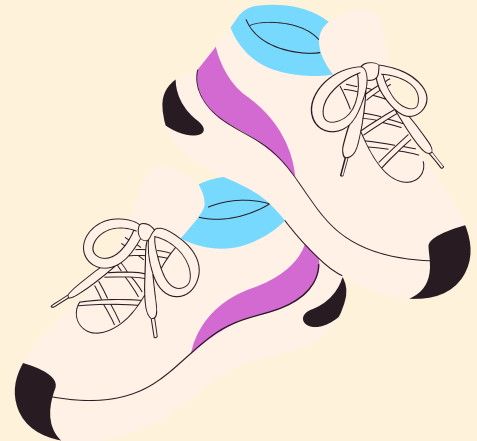
Year 4: We are performing a 12 bar blues song on keyboard.
