

Red Lanyard - Compulsory requirement

Thank you for ensuring that you enter the school premises with a red lanyard, or by showing appropriate identification to obtain a yellow visitor's lanyard. I would like to remind you that this policy is in place to ensure the safety and security of all our community members, especially our children, by ensuring that all personnel on site are authorised.

Please note the following:

 To avoid being stopped by security, ensure your lanyard is visible upon entry and while you remain on the premises.



- If you do not have a red lanyard for any reason, one can be obtained from the reception desk.
- If you have applied for a red lanyard but are still awaiting your card, you
 may collect a red lanyard from reception, and later pick up your card once it
 is ready.
- If you have not yet applied for a red lanyard, we advise you to do so at the reception desk. Otherwise, you will need to show ID and collect a yellow lanyard each time you enter.
- Please remember that staff on duty are carrying out their responsibilities if they ask you to show your lanyards or ID cards. Please be polite and courteous when engaging in any discussions.
- Despite security and support staff knowing you, there is no guarantee that all staff on site are familiar with you, particularly after you have dropped off your child. Therefore, please keep your lanyards visible at all times.



FRENCH HIGHLIGHTS

KS4 AND KS5 WORKING SCIENTIFICALLY

At DBS Rawdat, we take pride in nurturing curious, capable young scientists who engage in hands-on investigations to deepen their understanding of the world around them.

Recently, our Year 10 students have been exploring the fascinating relationship between light intensity and the rate of photosynthesis. Using hydrogen carbonate indicator, they observed how varying light conditions affect carbon dioxide levels in aquatic plants — a classic experiment that hones both observational and analytical skills.

Meanwhile, our Year 11 students have been mastering the art of organic chemistry by synthesising esters through simple distillation. With precision and patience, they used a Liebig condenser to produce and collect these sweet-smelling compounds, reinforcing their understanding of reaction processes, practical techniques, and safe laboratory practice.

It is wonderful to see both year groups developing not only their scientific knowledge but also the critical thinking and practical skills that will serve them well beyond the classroom.

EXCITING WORKSHOPS FROM CUQ AT ULSTER UNIVERSITY


As mentioned last week, CUQ at Ulster University is offering a series of exciting workshops exploring a variety of career paths.

- 16 April 1912 Harriet Quimby, an American aviator, becomes the first woman to fly across the English Channel, piloting her French Blériot monoplane from Dover, England, to Hardelot, France, through heavy overcast skies.
- 17 April 1982 The Canada Act, also known as the Constitution Act, is proclaimed. The legislation affirms Canada's full independence from the United Kingdom, granting it full sovereignty and establishing individual rights within a constitutional framework.


