WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

PRESCHOOL

This week in Preschool, we went on a listening walk around the school. We used our super-duper listening ears. We could hear animal and transportation sounds. In Maths, we learned a new term, "Making Comparisons". We are beginning to compare amounts in a set using mathematical vocabulary like more, fewer or the same.



This week in Reception we read the story 'Elmer" and spoke about how to be kind to our friends and to celebrate differences. In phonics we continued to read simple sentences and in Maths we continued learning 1 more than and 1 less than a given number.

Year 1

Year 1 have been exploring new vocabulary and grammar rules in English this week. They have applied them to sentences like 'The witch has three foxes. In Maths, Year 1 have been making number bonds and have been trying to do this systematically. They have painted, used counters and solved problems! We have rounded off the week with some savannah sunset pictures that look fabulous!



Year 2 have been looking at addition and subtraction of 2 digit numbers. In English, we are reading a new story called 'The Night Gardener'. We have been exploring some of the images within the story and using descriptive vocabulary to describe the setting. In Science, we started our new topic of Materials by identifying what different objects are made from.



Year 3 have been working on 3 digit addition and subtraction this week, they are getting very good at column method! In English we have been working on conjunctions, contractions and fronted adverbials and we started a new topic in Science where we are learning all about forces. During Foundation, we learned what fairtrade means and why it is so important.





Year 4 have had a special polar bear visit our classrooms this week in English to help us explore a new text called Leaf! Maths has found our pupils showing off their brilliant addition skills, uplevelling themselves to add two 4-digit numbers. In Foundation, we explored volcanoes and found out people actually live near them!

We debated the advantages and disadvantages of this.



This week in Year 5, we have been planning and writing our diary entries from the perspective of Henry 'Box' Brown, using powerful, emotive language. In maths, we have completed our topic on statistics (line graphs and tables) and in science we have been investigating forces such as air resistance and water resistance.



In Year 6 this week, we have been looking at the structure of an example flashback narrative. In Maths, we started our new topic on fractions and have identified equivalent fractions. In Science, we looked at how light is reflected and in Foundation, we wrote a biography on Nelson Mandela.



Year 1: Has been learning the members of the family linked to colors and gender.

Year 2: Has been learning to describe their pencil case using (Un, una, unos, unas)

Year 3: Has been learning to create simple sentences saying what they can see in a painting.

Year 4: Has been learning to write affirmative and negative sentences to describe their classroom.

Year 5: Has been learning to make descriptions using colour, shapes, adjectives and connectives according to the gender and numbers.

Year 6: Has been learning and practicing the numbers.



This week Primary students have been playing body percussion, chime bars (resonator bells) and percussion instruments. We are still learning about musical notation and instruments of the orchestra (woodwind, and string families), listening to the sound of the instruments and trying to understand the difference. Also practiced singing different melodies with SolFa hand signs. Pupils practiced "Good morning", "Bounce high", "Faded", "Apple tree" and "Count on me" songs. All pupils have been practising how to sing with proper singing technique.
