WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

PRESCHOOL

This week in Preschool, we showed our support of Anti–Bullying Week by wearing odd socks. In Phonics, we learned that we could use different musical instruments to imitate actions in the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. In Maths, we continued to compare amounts in a set.

Reception

This week in Reception, we read the story 'Commotion in the Ocean' and learnt about different sea creatures. In phonics we learnt the sound 'qu' and as a challenge we tried to read and write a sentence. We continued learning 1 more and 1 less in Maths. Additionally, we supported Anti-Bullying week by wearing odd socks and a decorated mask on Monday.

Year 1

Another mysterious parcel arrived at the Year 1 classes this week. Fortunately, it was sent to help us trap a troll so we have been learning all about instructions. In Maths, we have been exploring, comparing and solving number bonds. The fun didn't stop there; Year 1 planned a trip to Kenya! Tourism and climate were considered when packing our bag.



This week in Maths we have continued to learn Subtraction of 2 digit numbers as well as consolidating our number bonds. In English, we have explored key features such as similes and adjectives in our example text. In Science, we investigated different material properties of objects around our classroom.



In Maths this week we have been adding and subtracting two 3 digit numbers with and without exchanges, we have analysed our example text in English in preparation to start our class write next week, in Foundation we are starting our new topic learning all about the tropical rainforests and in Science we have been experimenting with magnets. Year 3 have also focussed on doing something kind for somebody else, in line with anti - bullying week,





What a week it has been for Extreme Earth! We were stunned to learn an earthquake took place in Iran, with tremors being felt in Dubai and Doha. We rushed to learn more about Earthquakes and now understand the power and magnitude of them. We have continued to learn addition in Maths and produced a beautiful setting description in English.



This week in Year 5, we have been writing up our final diary entries for Henry 'Box' Brown and we revisited figurative language techniques by writing shape poetry about his life. In maths, we have explored factors, multiples and prime numbers and in science we have developed our investigation skills by investigating forces such as friction.



This week in Year 6, we have been analysing our example text for 'A Story like the Wind' and writing our own diary entries. In Maths, we have been looking at fractions on a number line and converting improper fractions to mixed numbers. In Science, we made periscopes to develop our understanding of how light reflects.



Year 1: Has been learning to say what they have in their pencil case

Year 2: Has been learning the members of the family according to gender.

Year 3: Has been learning to say when their birthday is.

Year 4: Has been learning about the weather.

Year 5: Has been learning to describe pets using the agreements correctly.

Year 6: Has been learning about the family getting the gist of a longer passage.



This week Primary students have been playing body percussion, maracas, chime bars (resonator bells) and other percussion instruments. We are still learning about musical notation and instruments of the orchestra (brass, percussion, woodwind, and string families), listening to the sound of the instruments and trying to understand the difference. Also practiced singing different melodies with SolFa hand signs. Pupils practiced "Good morning", "Bounce high", "Faded", "Apple tree" and "Count on me" songs. All pupils have been practising how to sing with proper singing technique.


