WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

PRESCHOOL

This week in Preschool, we focused on rhyming words challenging ourselves to find new words that rhyme. In Maths, we continued to compare objects using vocabulary such as; same, small, big, tall and short. Finally, in Art time, we decorated the little characters from the video "Qatar, experienced a world beyond" in preparation for Qatar National Day.



This week in Reception we continued reading the story 'Shark in the Dark'. In phonics we learnt the sound 'th' and we wrote words and sentences using this sound and the new tricky word 'all'. We continued with addition in Maths and used Numicon to help us with counting.

Year 1

This week, Year 1 have been using number lines and counting back as well as finding the difference in Maths. They have independently written their own instructions on 'How to Catch a Witch',. In Foundation, they have made fantastic plans for constructing a Jeep, next week!



In English this week, we have been independently writing our own setting narrative based on The Night Gardener. In Maths, we have been counting British Money; finding the total and finding the difference. We have also designed our own football kits as part of our Qatar National Day art work for next week.



Year 3 have been planning and writing an explanation text, detailing how to capture the Space Bat Dragon in English. We have been investigating arrays in Maths, using counters. We explored the poles of a bar magnet in Science. We finished learning about the layers of the rainforest in Foundation. We thoroughly enjoyed making our trophy designs out of clay in preparation for the art competition next week as well!





In English, Year 4 have been using their plans to write an outsider narrative about a polar bear. In Maths, we have been consolidating understanding of addition our subtraction by using inverse operations to check our answers. Our Reading lessons have incredibly been exciting as we are approaching the final chapters of of 'How To Train Your Dragon'! We cannot wait to see how the story ends.



This week in Year 5, we have been practising our skills with writing a biography about Henry 'Box' Brown, making sure to include effective writing features such as parenthesis and relative clauses. In maths, we have been calculating area and perimeter of rectilinear shapes. In foundation we have been exploring art skills by drawing a viking longboat.



In Year 6 this week, we have been editing and improving our flashback narratives in English. In Maths, we have been multiplying and dividing fractions. In Science, we have been exploring shadows and the effect of moving an object closer to a light source. In Art, we have been drawing portraits of the significant individuals we have learned about in Foundation.



Year 1: Has been learning to give opinions with fruits using likes and dislikes.

Year 2: Has been learning to understand the concordance between nouns and adjectives using colors.

Year 3: Has been working with phonetics, pronunciation and spelling.

Year 4: Has been learning to describe the house using different types of adjectives applying the agreements.

Year 5: Has been learning more about Spain. They are making a research..

Year 6: Has been learning to describe their daily routine using connectives and time.



This week Primary students have been playing music games, body percussion, drums, chime bars, ukulele. We are learning about musical notation and instruments of the orchestra (brass, percussion, woodwind, and string families), listening to the sound of the instruments and trying to understand the difference. Students have been practising singing different melodies with SolFa hand signs. Pupils practised "Hello song", "Bounce high", "Apple tree", "Count on me" songs. All pupils have been practising how to sing with proper singing technique.
