WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

PRESCHOOL

Preschoolers have been showing fantastic attitudes during online learning. We listened to The Very Hungry Caterpillar and started building our vocabulary by answering the questions in longer sentences. We learned the s sound in phonics and focussed on words that begin with the sound. In Maths, we recapped shapes, colours, and objects that match.

Reception

Reception children were outstanding with their online learning this week. In phonics we learnt a new digraph 'ng' and we learnt the tricky word 'you'. Children were encouraged to read and write words and sentences with the same. We continued recapping addition in Maths and our topic for this week was 'Celebrating Birthdays'...

Year 1

Year 1 have been exploring 3D shapes. They have learnt the names of them and have been sorting, naming and solving problems with their properties.

In English, a strange video crept onto our Google Classroom; many things were going missing and luckily, Year 1 have figured out that Hermelin will save the day! They have written some sentences using is, are and adjectives to talk about the lost items.



We have started the new year off with online learning and we've all done an amazing job. In Maths, we have started our multiplication topic looking at equal groups and arrays. In English, we have looked at identifying nouns, proper nouns and verbs and how to use them in our writing. In Foundation, we started our new topic on Castles.



We are very proud of our year 3 students who have adapted fantastically to learning online this week. They have been using their, grouping sharing and times tables knowledge to solve multiplication and division problems. We have started exploring our vehicle text The Rhythm of the Rain in English and in Science the children have been rock detectives, collecting their own rock samples and using some tricky new vocabulary to describe their properties.





It has been a week of superb online learning from our Year 4 students! In English, they have been working hard to tackle tricky and confusing words (homophones) as well as using apostrophes for contraction. In Maths, the children have started to look at multiplying by 0,1,10 and 100. We were absolutely blown away by the Roman title pages created for our new Foundation topic!



Children in Year 5 have been showing fantastic attitude during online learning. For Maths, we have been learning about multiplying 4 digit numbers by 1 and have moved on to multiplying by 2 digits using area models. In English, we have explored and investigated our exciting new story: Sherlock Holmes and the Hound of the Baskervilles by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle.



Online this week, the children have explore our new book for English - Rose Blanche. They have written a contrasting poem and explored the themes of the text. In Reading, we have enjoyed read the first chapter of Letters from the Lighthouse. In Maths, we have been working on reading and placing coordinates on the four quadrants of a grid. Lastly, in Foundation, we identified the Allies and Axis powers during WW2.



Year 1: Has been reviewing the topic of the fruits and students have started to learn vocabulary about vegetables.

Year 2: Has been learning the parts of the house using the correct article in singular and plural.

Year 3: Has been learning to describe their house using affirmative and negative sentences.

Year 4: Has been learning the question words in Spanish.

Year 5: Has been learning to conjugate the regular verbs in Spanish

Year 6: Has been learning to conjugate the singular and the plural of the verbs ending in AR,ER,IR.



This week Primary students have been playing music games and body percussion. We are learning about musical notation and instruments of the orchestra (brass, percussion, woodwind, and string families), listening to the sound of the instruments and trying to understand the difference. Students have been practising singing different melodies with SolFa hand signs. Pupils practised "Hello song", "Bounce high", "Apple tree", "Count on me" songs. All pupils have been practising how to sing with proper singing technique.
