WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

#### PRESCHOOL

This week in Preschool, we learned that we could use our sharing words to invite our friends to play along. Next, in Phonics, we discovered a new sound; the "h" sound and words that begin with it. Finally, in Maths, we learned different ways to represent the number 9.



This week Year 1 have been planning their own non-chronological report about a Wild Thing. They look great so far. In Maths, Year 1 have been skip counting, in 2s and 5s. In Foundation, Year 1 imagined they were aboard Apollo 11 and wrote a diary entry as if they were an astronaut. In Science, we have been learning about trees and making posters to show what we know!

#### Year 3

This week, Year 3 have been working together to write an information leaflet about rivers. They used their research from last week. In Maths, the children continued to learn about fractions. The children are enjoying our new topic - Ancient Egypt. They located the country on a map and globe.

#### Reception

This week we read the story 'The Sandwich Swap' and discussed how we have our own likes and dislikes and how it is ok to be different from your friend. In phonics we learnt the trigraph 'ear' and wrote words and sentences with the same. We continued to learn halving in Maths which has been a bit of a challenge.



This week in Year 2, we have been looking at completing and planning our very own narrative piece based on 'The Headteacher who banned lessons!' It has been lots of fun, we have also explored a new unit in maths - Length and Height. We even used a metre stick! In Science, we made a paper plate life cycle of a butterfly. In Foundation, we looked at tides!





This week in Year 4, we have learned all about fractions greater than a whole and challenged ourselves to add and subtract fractions! In English, we have began to write as Mahek the Mother of the children as she is in the forest in the story 'The Journey'. In Reading, we have been immersed in our novel to find out if Chaya saves her best friend Neel.



This week in Year 5, we have been learning about angles during Maths and using protractors to read and measure acute angles. For English, we have been planning and writing a dramatic narrative linked to a Space mission. In Foundation, we have been exploring Northern Africa and focusing on some of the human and physical geographical features of Morocco.



In Year 6 this week, we have been writing our own magazine article about the mistakes that Ernest Shackleton made on his famous 1915 voyage to Antarctica. In Maths, we have been using ratio language and calculating ratios. In Science, we have been classifying animals based on their characteristics. In Foundation, we learned about Alexander the Great and the expansion of the Ancient Greek empire.



Year 1: Has been learning the parts of the face.

Year 2: Has been learning about shapes linked to colours and numbers.

Year 3: Has been learning to say their hair and eye colour in Spanish.

Year 4: Has been learning to describe pets.

Year 5: Has been learning to give and understand descriptions about houses

Year 6: Has been learning to describe their uniforme.




