## WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

## PRESCHOOL

This week in Preschool, we revisited the different sounds we could hear in the house, discussing which sounds are loud and soft, short and long. We made flag handprints of our home countries for International Day. In Maths, we revisited matching objects and pictures that are the same and recognising colours and shapes.



What a busy week in Year 1! In English, we used everything we have learnt from *'Major Glad, Major Dizzy'* and *'Albert's Discovery'* to write our own discovery story! In maths, we focused on ordinal numbers using medals for 1st to 10th place. We really enjoyed celebrating International Day and learning about the different nationalities in our class.



Year 3 children have been amazing authors this week. They have written an approaching threat narrative. In Maths they have been learning how to exchange when subtracting, using column method. Our year 3 Scientists explored which surfaces have the best reflection properties and during Foundation we tasted and described some delicious chocolate and the children are now inventing and designing their own chocolate products. Finally, we thoroughly enjoyed celebrating international day!



In Reception we learned about different nationalities and cultures. We discussed how everyone is different and that it is OK to be different. In Maths we matched numeral and quantity using numicons. In Phonics we continued segmenting and blending sounds.



This week we have been writing our own letters about the forest, practising addition and subtraction using place value columns and the column method. On Monday, we spent the afternoon being doctors and nurses in the style of Florence Nightingale. Finally, we enjoyed many International Day activities.



The children in Year 4 have had a wonderful week completing a range of Art activities for International Day. They learned about the importance of respecting other cultures and shared recipes of a traditional meal from their home country. In Maths the children learned about negative numbers and roman numerals. In English they completed a newspaper report about a dolphin spotted on the Corniche! Well done and happy holidays!



This week in Year 5, we have been writing a newspaper report. For Maths, we have been using inverse operations and bar models to help solve multi-step problems. In science, we have explored reversible and irreversible reactions - making observations of how water particles change state depending on energy. In Qatar History, we learned about the resources of Qatar.



Year 1: Has been learning to say and write the colours.

Year 2: Has been learning to identify and correctly pronounce difficult sounds in Spanish. Year 3: Has been learning to count and write numbers until 100.

Year 4: Has been learning the basic diary routines.

Year 5: Has been learning the parts of the computer and write sentences using "Es/Son" Year 6: Has been researching a Spanish Speaking Country and making a Project.



This week in Year 6, we have been finalising our persuasive letters. Our letters were written to a member of parliament during the time of the Transatlantic Slave Trade, requesting them to bring an end to slavery. In Maths, we have consolidated our understanding of the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) by producing a journal.



This week Primary students have been playing body percussion, percussion instruments and resonator bells. We are still learning about instruments of the orchestra (string family), listening to the sound of the instruments and trying to understand the difference. Students have been learning about ostinato and notes values. Also practiced singing different melodies with SolFa hand signs. Pupils practiced "Good morning", "Bounce high bounce low" and "Count on me" songs. All pupils have been practising how to sing with proper singing technique.
