WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

PRESCHOOL

This week in Preschool, we continued to work on using our sharing words when playing with our friends. Then, in Phonics, we revisited the sounds we have learnt so far and the words that begin with them. Finally, in Maths, we learned to match objects equal to a number.

Reception

This week in reception we read the story 'Have you filled your bucket today?' and spoke about how you can fill someone's invisible bucket by doing something nice to make them smile. In phonics we learnt a new sound 'air' and wrote words and sentences with the same. We recapped Addition, subtraction, doubling and halving in Maths this week.

Year 1

This week, Year 1 have been learning about weight and mass; using the balance scales was a real highlight.

In English, they have written a non-chronological report about a wild thing and begun to learn about split digraphs in Phonics. Using play-do and pipe cleaners really helped their understanding.

YEAR 2

This week in Year 2, we have produced our final piece of narrative writing based on the 'The Headteacher who banned lessons.' In Maths, we explored the difference between centimetres and metres. In Foundation, we made our own seaside Art! In Science, we started to understand the life cycle of humans!



This week, Year 3 have been using their place value knowledge to order important historical events on a timeline. Then, they used this to order important events that happened during the Ancient Egypt period. In Science, they made up actions to help them remember the lifecycle of a flowering plant.





This week in Year 4, we have produced our final diary entries based on the story 'The Journey'. In Maths, we have successfully finished our Fractions topic where children are now able to find a fraction of a quantity! In Science, we concluded our water evaporation experiment and presented the data on a line graph.



This week in Year 5, we have been planning and writing a dramatic narrative during our English lesson. We focused on short, sharp sentences to build tension. For Maths, we have been learning about how to measure angles using a protractor, calculating missing angles on a straight line and around a point. During our Foundation lessons, we have been analysing and recreating a painting in the style of African artist – 'Edward Tingatinga'.



This week in Year 6, we have been calculating scale factors and solving problems involving ratio in Maths. In English, we have been editing and improving our magazine articles. In Science, we have been finding out about harmful and helpful microorganisms. In Foundation, we ordered key events in Ancient Greece chronologically.



Year 1: Has been learning the parts of the body.

Year 2: Has been learning about the park animals.

Year 3: Has been learning to say their hair and eye colour in Spanish using the agreement correctly.

Year 4: Has been learning to describe pets using colour, numbers, singular and plural.

Year 5: Has been learning to describe houses.

Year 6: Has been learning about names of shops in Spanish.


