WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

PRESCHOOL

This week in Preschool, we learnt that a person could hear different sounds in different house areas. Again, we used our good listening skills. In Maths, we learned how to match the same colour objects into various groups, building our mathematical vocabulary by focusing on using the word match in a sentence while sorting the different colours.



This week in Reception we learned a poem called, 'Leaves are falling.' We made broomsticks which links to the story we have been reading. In Maths we learnt different ways of counting e.g. using claps, jumps etc.



This week in Year 1 we have been talking about what makes a good story in preparation for writing our own stories. We have been using our book, 'Major Glad, Major Dizzy' to help us with ideas. In maths, we have been learning how to compare numbers by describing them as 'greater than, 'less than' or 'equal to'. In foundation, we learnt the primary and secondary colours and made our own colour wheels!



We have started our new topic of Addition and Subtraction, looking at number bonds and fact families. In English, we have been uplevelling our Swag Bag vocabulary for shared and independent writing about a tiger. In Foundation, we enjoyed making our very own Lantern lamps!



This week in Maths, the children have been exploring how to add 3 - digit numbers to 1 digit numbers using the base 10 equipment to help them understand exchanges. In English the children wrote their fantastic setting descriptions for The Iron Man. We did a class experiment to find out how we can change the size of shadows in Science and watched some of the amazing shadow puppet shows the children made!





Our week consisted of incredible ordering skills in Maths, where the children successfully ordered 4-digit numbers in ascending and descending order! In English, they created toolkits to help them remember the features of a newspaper report. They had lots of fun In Foundation learning about the parts of a Volcano and how they are formed.



This week in Year 5, we have been exploring negative numbers and recapping Roman Numerals in mathematics. In English, we have delved into our narrative character descriptions, using a variety of language features to impact our readers. In science, we have been investigating if different materials are solutes or not by observing if they are soluble or insoluble.



This week in Year 6, we have been been adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing numbers using the formal written methods. In English, we have analysed a model persuasive letter. We held several debates created statistics to support our arguments. For Science, we conducted an experiment to see how voltage affects a lightbulb in a circuit!



Year 1: Has been learning more greetings and the song "Greetings, daily routines"

Year 2: Has been reviewing the days of the week and the months of the year.

Year 3: Has been learning the agreement between nouns and colours.

Year 4: Has been learning to write the numbers until 500.

Year 5: Has been learning formal and informal introductions.

Year 6: Has been learning to use countries, nationalities and languages according to gender and number.



This week Primary students have been playing body percussion and percussion instruments. We are still learning about instruments of the orchestra (percussion family) listening to the sound of the instruments and trying to understand the difference. Also students have been learning about elements of music (dynamics, tempo). Students practiced singing different melodies with SolFa hand signs and sang "Roar", "Bounce high bounce low", "Faded" and "Count on me" songs. All pupils have been practising how to sing with proper singing technique.
