WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

PRESCHOOL

What an incredible first week in Preschool. The students are starting to settle in. They are beginning to learn the routines. The children have been exploring all the areas of the classroom. They enjoyed painting their Lions and playing outside on the slides. Next week the children will be staying in school until 11 am.



Year 1 have settled in so well and adjusted to their new routines at school; we are very proud of them.

In English, we have been focussing on the story of Rapunzel after we found clues in our classrooms! In Maths, we have been sorting into different categories. In Foundation, we kicked off our 'Art Attack' topic with creating art in the style of Jackson Pollock.



Throughout the week, the children have worked out that it was the Iron Man who made a mess in the Hippo classroom. This was an exciting start to our English topic. In Maths, the children have been introduced to 3 digit numbers. The children found a cave and cave woman in the classroom to start our Foundation topic - The Stone Age.

We are so proud of all the Reception children this week. They have settled in quickly to their new classes and have instantly learnt the new routines. The children have been exploring all of the new areas of the classroom and have been sharing and taking turns with the new toys. Next week the children will be staying in school until 11am.



In Year 2 this week, it has been fantastic to have everyone back in School.In English we have been focusing on 'The River' story and even made our own boats! In Maths we have been learning about our number bonds to 100. In Foundation, we have been learning about the continents and Oceans.



What an incredible start to Year 4! Our pupils have settled into their new routines smoothly and have shown great interest and curiosity during our lessons all week! In Maths, children have been reviewing their place value knowledge and in English, they've been warming up their handwriting skills by writing a letter to their future self!



It's been a great first week back for Year 5! Our new class novel, Oh Freedom, was introduced and we made predictions based on the title, front cover and blurb. In Science, we discussed what a scientist is to us and used key vocabulary to inspire our posters. In English, we took part in drama activities to share our predictions on the vehicle text linking to our upcoming topic.



This week Spanish students from Year 1 to Year 6 have been learning the classroom expectation, to understand mark books and also introduce themselves in Spanish according to the level.



Year 6 have had an excellent start to the new year! This week, we have been focusing on reading and writing numbers up to 10 million. We have used drama to identify key events in the vehicle text. In Reading, we have been making predictions and inferences for our WW2 novel. Finally, in Foundation, we identified key countries involved in the war.



What an incredible first week we had. This week Primary students have been playing music games and body percussion. We are learning about musical notation. Students have been practising singing different melodies with SolFa hand signs. Students practised "Hello song", "Dance monkey", "Good morning song". All pupils have been practising how to sing with proper singing technique.
