PRESCHOOL

It was a musical week in Preschool, we looked at all sorts of instruments but our main focus were the sounds that drums, bells, cymbals and shakers make.

Naturally, we had a shaking party exploring our shapes and colours. The children were also introduced to the big celebration, FIFA, where Lion class will be representing Qatar and Llama class Ecuador.



It has been a great week. We drew our favourite sea creature and we drew a story map to retell 'The Shark in the Dark'. In maths, we learnt about 1,2,3 and how we make the number 3. We also went outside to do squiggle while you wiggle. It was so much fun!

Year 1

It has been a very busy week in Year 1! In English, the children have shown their creativity by planning their own Discovery Narrative! In maths, they have been exploring different methods to help them add numbers and have even solved addition problems! In Science, they have continued to classify animals, this week by body type! In Foundation, they have been creating their own hand puppet.



In Year 2, we have had such an exciting yet busy week! We have completed a class write based on The Night Gardener. We have looked and compared 2D and 3D shapes in maths. In Foundation, we have been learning how to sew and looked at different sewing techniques. In Science, we have continued to explore materials and their different properties.



Year 3 are very excited about the World Cup competitions and the Character Development mascot. They enjoyed learning about Argentina and creating a poster. In English, they have independently researched facts about wolves and written an information report. In Maths, they have been using the column method to solve addition and subtraction calculations.





It has been an exciting week in Year 4! In DT, we have been looking at different styles of jewellery and even had the chance to look at our teacher's special jewellery box. In Geography, we explored the fascinating world of Scandinavia. Maths has been incredible this week as children have shown off their fantastic multiplication and division skills!

This week in Year 5, we started our Fractions unit in Maths by looking at equivalent fractions. In English, we completed our class write of a third person character narrative We look at the structure and language of poems in Reading. In DT, we learned about and practised different types of stitching.



In Year 6 this week, we have been solving word problems that involved adding and subtracting mixed number fractions. In English, we have been writing flashback narratives. In Reading, we have read a range of war time poetry. In Foundation, we have written a diary entry from the perspective of Anne Frank. Lastly, in Qatar History, we learned about the civilisations that lived in Qatar before us.



Year 1: Has been learning to say what they have in their pencil case

Year 2: Has been learning the means of transportation + likes and dislikes.


Year 3: Has been learning to say when is their birthday.

Year 4: Has been learning the basic diary routines.

Year 5: Has been learning to describe pets using the agreements correctly.

This week Primary students have been playing music games, body percussion, drums, chime bars, ukulele and other percussion instruments. We are learning about musical notation and instruments of the orchestra (brass, percussion, woodwind, and string families), listening to the sound of the instruments and trying to understand the difference. Students have been practising singing different melodies with SolFa hand signs. Students practised "Living on a prayer" "Hands, feet, heart", "Good morning song", "Mamma Mia". All pupils have been practising how to sing with proper singing technique.

17th November- School Closes for Winter Break Monday 2nd January- School Starts for Spring Term.




