WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?



During this week we have allowed the children to explore their different emotions, such as happy or sad - they enjoyed linking this to Goldilocks and the Three Bears. The Lions class also investigated different Environmental sounds that are made by leaves, twigs, paper bags, keys and pebbles. The children were introduced to the Llama class and enjoyed making their 'Leafy' Self-portrait there. The weather also allowed them enjoy playtime a lot more.



Year 1 have had such a busy and exciting week! On Monday, we found some old toys in our classroom including two toy soldiers called Major Glad and Major Dizzy. We also found a book about these soldiers and made a list of noun phrases based on the pictures. In Foundation, we started our History topic about old toys! During maths lessons this week we explored addition using the part-whole model!



This week, Year 3 started their new text in English - The fox. They explored themes and made connections. In Maths, the children have been using base 10 to add and subtract multiples of 100. In Geography, the children looked at volcanoes around the world. In Science, they started a new topic - Rocks and Soil.



This week we have been reading a new story, Elmer. We enjoyed the story as it discussed how it is ok to be different. In Phonics, we have now moved onto practising our letter formation for the Phase 2 sounds as well as our segmenting and blending skills. In Maths, we have been learning about patterns. We have made our own as well as correcting ones where there are mistakes. We have also made a giant Elmer as a whole class art activity.



This week in Year 2, we have explored noun phrases in English. In Maths, we have been learning about addition and subtraction by crossing tens. In Science, we explored what animals eat. In Foundation, we produced an excellent painting piece of the Jungle which was very similar to Henri Rousseau. It has been a blast.



This week in Year 4, we have explored the exciting life of Leaf, our dear polar bear who has travelled all the way from the Arctic! In Maths, we have accomplishment our goal to add numbers with more than one exchange. History has been incredibly fascinating as we have explored who the Vikings were and where they came from (Scandinavia).



Year 5

This week in Year 5, we have been finding common multiples and common factors in Maths. In English, we have immersed ourselves in our new vehicle text "The Promise". In Foundation, we investigeagted case studies of modern slavery. Our focus for art this week was observational drawing facial features such as eyes, noses, and mouths.



Year 1: Has been learning to reproduce the sounds of the consonant linked to vowels. Year 2: Has been learning the alphabet linked to tricky sounds.

Year 3: Has been learning the name of the shapes according to the number of sides. Year 4: Has been learning classroom items

according to singular and plural.

Year 5: Has been learning the parts of the computer linked to the verb Ser in singular and plural.


Year 6.Has been learning the regular verbs ending in -AR.



In Year 6 this week, we have been reasoning from known facts in Maths and estimating. In English, we used drama and musical instruments to bring a scene from our vehicle text alive. In Science, we have been identifying different sources of light: natural and man-made. In DT, we researched about what the term 'refugees' mean as we prepare to make a refugee survival kit!



This week Primary students have been playing music games, body percussion, drums, chime bars, ukulele and other percussion instruments. We are learning about musical notation and instruments of the orchestra (brass, percussion, woodwind, and string families). Students have been practising singing different melodies with SolFa hand signs. Students practised "Living on a prayer" "Hands, feet, heart", "Good morning song", "Mamma Mia". All pupils have been practising how to sing with proper singing technique.

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
