#### WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

#### PRESCHOOL

What a wonderful week in Preschool, we had so much fun getting our hands' dirty planting carrots and onions in our garden. In phonics, we learned the 'j' sound and the words that begin with it. In Maths, we look at numbers zero to three and how we can represent them differently.



We've had another great week in Reception. We've learnt about Chinese New Year and we wrote about what we can see in the picture. We focused on different ways we can represent and make 4. We have also painted a blossom tree.

#### Year 1

Year 1 have had such a collaborative week!
We have been using teamwork across the curriculum and really been testing each others' knowledge. In English, we have been learning about letter features and recapping time conjunctions. In Maths we have started our Shape unit which begins with 3D shape. In Science, we have been on a scavenger hunt around school to explore our senses. We have designed our final fruit salad which we will make next year!



What a week we have had! This week in Year 2, we explored the key features of the example text in English. In Maths, we started our new topic of Multiplication and Division. In Science, we looked at different ways in which objects can be changed. In Foundation, we made our own maps with lots of key features taught such a hills, mountains and even volcanoes.



Year 3 have had another busy week. In English, the children have been learning to write similes. They are going to use these in their setting descriptions next week. In Maths, they have worked hard to learn a song about the 4x table. In Foundation, the children created their own timelines to show the history of chocolate. They used their Maths knowledge to order dates.





It has been a busy week for Penguin and Butterfly class! In Maths, we have looked at multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100. We have also strived to learn our 5x table chant. In English, we have explored the key features of our example text in English. This helped us create a toolkit which we will use for our own writing next week.



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Year 5 have enjoyed a great week! We started our new Maths unit - Multiplication and Division. In English, we have been writing a class example of an exploration narrative to Mars. In Science, we named and identified the reason for the phases of the moon. In Art, we began creating our abstract space backgrounds in the style of Peter Thorpe. In Foundation, we wrote biographies of astronauts.



We have had a great week in Year 6! We started our new Maths unit - decimals. In English, we have been writing a class example of an information text about wolves. In Science, we considered how exercise affected our heart by measuring our BPM after a workout. In Art, we looked in magazines and newspapers to find pop culture images that we can use to experiment with mixed media next week!



Year 1: Has been learning the names of the vegetables according to gender.

Year 2: Has been learning the parts of the house.

Year 3: Has been learning some adjectives to describe people.


Year 4: Has been learning to describe the house using adjectives and connectives.

Year 5: Has been learning to describe their school bag using affirmative and negative sentences.

Year 6. Has been learning to give an opinion about food using the agreements correctly.



This week Primary students have been playing music games, body percussion, drums, chime bars, ukulele and other percussion instruments. We are learning about musical notation and instruments of the orchestra (brass, percussion families), listening to the sound of the instruments and trying to understand the difference. Students have been practising singing different melodies with SolFa hand signs. Pupils practised "Hello song", "Dreamers", "Apple tree", "Rhythm in the way we walk" songs. All pupils have been practising how to sing with proper singing technique.
