We have been learning our Phase 3 sounds in phonics too and new tricky words. We have been challenging ourselves in construction by making a place for a wedding, a wedding car and wedding flowers! How creative!

Year 1

Year 1 have had such a productive week!
They have planned some very interesting letters to write next week, using so many grammatical features! In Maths, they have been creating patterns and solving problems with 2D and 3D shapes. In Science, Year 1 thought about different flavours. And, the highlight of the week... making our fruit salads. They looked amazing and Year 1 were so independent. Well done!

YEAR 2

What a week we have had in Year 2! This week we have created our own Sand bug creatures for English to support us for our writing task. We even produced a class plan about the habitat of a Sand bug. In Maths, we have been looking at sharing and grouping objects into equal parts. In Science we explored the different parts of a plant. In Foundation we brought in some shells and completed some observational drawing of them! This was so much fun.

Year 3

Year 3 have had a busy week practising for their assembly on Sunday. They are very excited! In English, we began our shared write. They children will use these ideas to help them write their own setting descriptions next week. In Maths, we have been using different methods to solve multiplication calculations. The children enjoyed making and drinking a Mayan hot chocolate in Foundation lessons.





This week in Year 4, Butterfly and Penguin children have multiplied 2-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers! In English, we have started to bring ideas together to help us write a diary entry as a character within our story 'The Journey'. Our adventure with Narnia has been full of suspense this week with children applying their VIPERS skills.

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Year 5 had a fantastic week! We have planned and written some fantastic exploration narratives, using all the key grammatical features! In Maths, we have been practicing the formal written methods of multiplication and division. In Science, we put all our theoretical knowledge into practice by creating orbiting models and sundials to tell time. In Art, we are drawing spaceships in the foreground of our abstract paintings.



In Year 6 this week, we have been adding and subtracting decimals and multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000. In English, we have been planning and writing our information text about an animal. In Foundation, we identified human and physical geographical features of North America. Lastly, in Qatar History, we have been learning about Qatari culture and heritage.



Year 1: Has been learning to give an opinion about the vegetables using likes and dislikes.

Year 2: Has been learning to describe their house.

Year 3: Has been learning to describe people in first, second and third person.

Year 4: Has been learning to describe the house using different types of adjectives applying the agreements.

Year 5: Has been learning the time using "y" and "menos"

Year 6. Has been learning to give information about their favourite foods using frequency adverbs.



This week Primary students have been playing rhythm games, body percussion beats, and percussion instruments. We were learning musical notation. Students have been practising singing different melodies with SolFa hand signs. 'Peter and the Wolf' watched the story, discussed characters and instruments, and listened to character themes individually. Pupils practised "Rhythm song" 'Dreamers" "Good morning song" All pupils have been practising how to sing with proper singing technique.










4) SEARCH FOR DOHA BRITISH SCHOOL


Type 'Doha British Schools' in the search bar. Then click on the green bar that says "This is my school'. It will take you to the sign in page




5) SIGN IN USING YOUR SCHOOL EMAIL
