#### WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?



What a fantastic week! Preschool had the opportunity to meet the author Kayla Diamond. In Phonics, we learnt the 'u' sound and the words that begin with it. We manipulated the playdough to bend in the shape of an 'u' and challenged ourselves to trace the sound on a sheet. We continue to compare the numbers zero to five in different ways. As part of Hygiene, we learnt it is important to brush our teeth twice a day and to limit eating candy.



It has been a really exciting week in Year 1! The children took on the role of Hermelin the detective mouse and wrote some excellent letters to the people of Offley Street! In maths, we started to extend our knowledge of place value all the way to 20! In Foundation, we evaluated the super fruit salads that we made last week and thought about how we could make them even better!



This week was very exciting for year 3! In English we have been working together as a class on our shared write from the book Rhythm of the Rain! In Maths we have continued to learn about multiplication and division. Some of the year 3 children had the opportunity to take part in an athletics competition where all the children displayed great motivation and resilience!



What a fantastic week in Reception. We have been learning about one more, one less and altogether in maths. We have been talking about the days of the week too! Our topic has been about Weddings and we have been designing wedding dresses and suits. We have also been practising more Phase 3 sounds in phonics like: qu, ng and ai. We also met the author Kayla Diamond!



What a fantastic week we have had in Year 2! We have managed to complete our independent HOT tasks based on instruction writing. In Maths, we have explored doubling and halving amounts. In Science, we were able to explore the stages of a plant life cycle. In Foundation, we were able to sketch our own shells using inspiration from Georgia O'Keefe.



What a week it has been for Year 4! In English, we completed our diary entries before we were given a magical task by an Old Hag! In Maths, we have been tackling multiplication and division of 2 and 3-digit numbers. In Foundation, we had an incredible debate on the pros and cons of the Romans invading Britain. What a busy but exciting week 6!





This week in Year 5, we completed our Maths unit on long multiplication and division, and began looking at multiplying fractions. In Art, we created our own abstract space art in the style of Peter Thorpe. We worked in pairs to edit and improve our Hot Tasks so that we can publish our final copies. In Reading, we battled it out again with the Big Quiz, this time looking at a non-fiction text. Well done Year 5!

Year 2: Has been learning the parts of the face.

Year 3: Has been learning to identify between verbs, adjectives and nouns.

Year 4 Has been learning to describe the weather.

Year 5: Has been learning to say digital and analog time.


Year 6. Has been learning to describe people using the parts of the body and the adjectives.



In Year 6 this week, we have been completing our hot tasks in English. We can't wait to read our final information texts about an animal! In Maths, we have been multiplying and dividing decimals and solving problems in different contexts. In Foundation, we learned about the Transatlantic Slave Trade and how this impacted the Civil Rights Movement many centuries later.



This week Primary students have been playing rhythm games, body percussion beats, and percussion instruments. We were learning musical notation. Students have been practising singing different melodies with SolFa hand signs. Watched music stories, discussed characters and instruments, and listened to character themes individually. Students practised "Rhythm in the way we walk "Hands, feet, heart", "Good morning song". All pupils have been practising how to sing with proper singing technique.


