### **PRESCHOOL**

## Reception

In Reception this week we have been super busy! We have been on our first ever trip to Kidzmondo, where we had lots of fun exploring all of the different areas. We have also started rehearsals for The Gingerbread Man. We also found time to write about our favourite part of the trip and we continued to practise our number recognition to 10.

## Year 1

It has been a very exciting week in Year 1! We have further explored our story of Black Rock through role-play and freeze frames, which the children performed brilliantly! maths. partitioned In we numbers to 50 into tens and ones. In science, we have been exploring seasonal changes and weather patterns. highlight of our week was our trip to KidZania!



This week in English we looked at Acrostic Poems and wrote our own poems around the topics 'fireworks' and 'kindness'. In maths, we have continued to learn about time. We can now tell the time at quarter past and quarter to the hour. We've also been busy making final preparations for our assembly on Sunday, perfecting our actions, lines and singing voices!



Year 3 have had a lovely week! In Maths we are coming to an end with fractions and the children have showcased their knowledge by doing excellently in the end of topic test! In English we have started our Big Write, the children have been using research on rainforests to write their own information leaflet. Our class scientists completed a science experiment investigating plants and planting their own sunflower seeds!





What a wonderful week we have had in Year 4! Our mathematicians have been smashing their new decimal topic! In English, our inquisitive butterguins have written a formal letter to Jacques Cousteau inquiring about his many adventures and achievements. Our future scientists have been working hard to investigate and classify animals based on their features. Keep up the hard work!

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This week in Year 5 we have completed our Shape unit in Maths. We explored the properties of 2-D and 3-D shapes. In English, we explored similes and metaphors to describe the appearance of King Kong before writing a list poem. In Science we compared the life cycles of different mammals. We also started our new History unit all about the ancient kingdom of Benin.



In Year 6 this week, we have been identifying the key features of a magazine article in English. In Maths, we calculated the area of triangles, parallelograms and calculated the volume of 3D shapes. In Science, we designed our own animals and classified them based on their characteristics. In Art, we made our own Ancient Greek vases fit for a specific purpose.

Year 3: Has been learning about pets.


Year 4: Has been learning to describe pets linked with numbers and colours.
