WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?



It has been an adventurous week in Preschool. First, we learned the names of different air vehicles. Then, we went on a trip pretending to fly an aeroplane. What a fun ride. In mark making, we challenged ourselves to write our name and to draw a Hot Air Balloon. Next, we learned the n sound in phonics and the words that begin with it. Finally, in Maths, we continued to look at number bonds up to four.



It has been a very exciting week in Year 1 as we have welcomed back Mrs Johnston to the Bat Class! Learning has been in full swing as we focused on estimating on the number line to 50 and finding one more and one less than a given number. In English, we created some excellent settings for Erin to travel to on her next adventure. In Science, we explored different types of weather including thunderstorms and snowy conditions.



This week Year 3 started their new English text - Egyptology. The children are going to learn how to write a mystery narrative. In Maths, they have been learning to tell the time. In Science, the children are still looking after their plants and learned about the life cycle. In Reading lessons, we have been focusing on summarising. In Foundation lessons, the children enjoyed learning about the ancient ritual of mummification.



This week in Reception, we have been learning about numbers to 20! We have also been making observations about our bean seeds and watering them daily. In phonics we have learnt the sounds 'igh' 'ure' 'ear' and 'air'. As we are preparing for the Summer Extravaganza, we have been practising for our Gingerbread Man production every day! We are so excited. We have also had lunch in the canteen this week and that has been so much fun!



This week in Year 2 we have been exploring reading the time to the nearest 5 minutes! We are now experts at this. In English we have been looking at our new story book called Rosie Revere, Engineer. In Science, we been learning about what animals need to survive. In Foundation we wrote our own acrostic poems about the King and Emir.



This week has found Year 4 in the midst of Decimals in Maths! Our Butterguins are now able to divide 1 or 2-digit numbers by 10 and 100. In English, we have been creating setting poems based on the Blue Planet clip to promote awareness of ocean pollution. Some children even went to the beach over the weekend to pick up rubbish! What an incredible community we have in Year 4!



Year 5

This week we revisited Decimals in Maths. We added and subtracted decimals within 1 and used know fact to find complements to 1. In English Writing, we investigated key vocabulary and phrases from our example text and incorporated them into a paragraph that introduces a dilemma and utilises direct speech to advance the story. In Science, we used our data skills to chart and compare the gestation periods of mammals. In History, we debated about the return of the Benin Bronzes back to Nigeria.



Year 1: Has been learning the part of the face linked with singular and plural.

Year 2: Has been learning about shapes and colours.

Year 3: Has been learning to describe pets. Year 4: Has been learning the parts of the city.

Year 5: Has been learning to give information about rooms in their house.


Year 6. Has been learning to describe their uniforme using adjectives.



Our highlight this week was our trip to Bounce! The children played class games and got to show-off their trampoline skills! In Maths, we have been reading and interpreting line graphs, pie charts and calculating the mean. In English, we have been writing class writes about the successes of Ernest Shackleton. In Foundation, we evaluated our Ancient Greek vases.



This week Primary students have been playing music games, body percussion, drums, chime bars, ukulele and other percussion instruments. We are learning about musical notation and instruments of the orchestra (brass, percussion families), listening to the sound of the instruments and trying to understand the difference. Students have been practising singing different melodies with SolFa hand signs. Pupils practised "Hello song", "Bounce high", "Apple tree", "Rhythm in the way we walk", 'Dreamers' songs.




The very earliest children should be in school is 6:40 am as this is the time that members of staff will come on duty to ensure the safeguarding of your children.
