WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

PRESCHOOL

This week in Preschool, we explored friends and our feelings. We read the story My Blue is Happy. We now know that the same colour could bring out different feelings between us and our friends. In Phonics, we discussed the b sound and words that begin with it. Preschool is bubbling with excitement regarding The Gingerbread Man production. Mummy and Daddy, do you have your ticket?



It has been a jam packed week in Reception as we have been learning about adding in maths, revisiting our phase 3 sounds and preparing for the Gingerbread Man production. We have been focussing on our reading comprehension skills by drawing the missing information into our pictures. We have also been doing a lot of Gingerbread Man writing too. We are getting super excited for our big show on Monday 12th, and we hope to see Mummys and Daddys there!

Year 1

It has been a super busy week in Year 1! We have been using our storyboards and toolkits to plan a return story. We are really excited to put all our ideas together for our final write next week. In maths, we have completed our multiplication and division topic by learning how to create equal groups and how to share equally. We have also been busy with rehearsals for our assembly, we can't wait to showcase it on Sunday!



In Year 2 this week it has been busy as usual with lots of learning. In Maths, we further explored pictograms. In English, we completed a class shared write. In Science, we looked at how exercise affects our body and the different changes. In Foundation, we continued to explore the different features of the class and even designed our own castles!

Year 3

This week Year 3 have demonstrated a lot determination during the TTRS competition. In Maths, they have been learning to tell the time to the minute. In English, the children have been exploring the tune of the text through relating to the character's feelings and asking questions. In Science, the children are investigating how long it takes the stem of a plant to transport water from the roots to the leaves.





This week has been a busy one for Year 4! We powered through our Money topic in Maths and can now confidently identify British coins and notes. In English, we interviewed Mr Braithwaite and Mr Kutts to gather information to write a biography about them! Our pupils asked incredibly detailed and in depth questions which made our teachers really think about their answers.

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This week in Year 5 we completed our Decimals unit with effective methods of addition and subtraction. In Writing, we wrote our shared class write Dinosaur Dilemma about a paleontologist who is trying to capture a pterodactyl. We utilised all our VIPER skills in reading while reading a poem, non-fiction, and fiction texts. In Science, we compared the life cycles of animals who go through metamorphosis such as frogs and butterflies.



In Year 6 this week, we have been measuring, identifying and calculating angles. We have also been identifying the circumference, diameter and radius of circles. In Reading, we have read two new fiction texts - A Howl at Dusk and A Noise in the Night. In English, we have consolidated our understanding of grammar, punctuation and spelling rules.

Year 3: Has been learning to use clothes with the correct agreements.


Year 4: Has been learning to use prepositions of place for describing location.
