Year 5 have had a fantastic week of learning. We have truly settled into our new and exciting academic year. In Maths, we have been learning all about place value, using manipulatives to identify the value of digits. In Science, we have completed an investigation with our very own helicopters to help us understand air resistance. In English, we have thoroughly enjoyed up to chapter 5 of The Jamie Drake Equation!



It's been another great week in Year 6! In Maths, we have begun our Place Value unit by comparing and ordering 7-digit numbers. In English, we created our own contrast poem comparing our main character Rose Blanche with a WW2 soldier. Our WW2 topic has kicked off with exploring the reasons why the war began and placing key events in a chronological timeline.



Year 1: Has been learning basic classroom commands.

Year 2: Has been learning how to give and write basic classroom commands.

Year 3: Has been reviewing classroom command and children have been learning the division of words by syllables.


Year 4: Has been learning new vocabulary about classroom instructions by using full sentences.


