WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

PRESCHOOL

What a wonderful week in Preschool. We visited the Library for the first time this week. We enjoyed listening to a story and exploring the different books in the Library. We continued to practise naming parts of our bodies. In Phonics, we learned that vehicles make different sounds, and if we listen very carefully, we can name the vehicle by just listening to the sound it makes.



We had a super busy week in Reception! We learnt about Elmer the patchwork elephant and we talked about what makes us special and unique. We have been working so hard in Phonics too, we learned "t" and "p" and we tried our best at writing. In maths, we learnt about counting and representing 1,2,3, one more and one less. Miss Niculae and Miss Kong are super proud of us!



Wow, what a fantastic week our bats and butterflies have had. In English, we welcomed Dexter the troll and used our growing vocabulary to describe this mythical creature. Year 1 have continued to become mathematicians, comparing numbers and groups using the greater than, less than and equal to symbols. We conducted a very fun experiment to test our sense of taste using our taste buds. We can conclude our favourite taste is sweet!



We have had a busy and productive week in Year Two. In English, we have experimented with using new and interesting adjectives to add detail to our writing. In Maths, we have delved deeper into our number topic and compared two digit numbers. We have been explorers in Geography and explored the countries of China and Australia. What a great week!



We have had an amazing week in year 3! In Maths we have continued to learn about Place Value. In English, we began to write and edit our own setting paragraphs. We have had lots of interactive learning in science where we made our own pasta skeletons! Year 3 also had the opportunity to learn all about exoskeletons and hydrostatic skeletons, by touching and being able to see a real example of a crab and octopus.

We have started our new Art Topic on the Stone Age, where we have learnt all about different techniques of drawing!





This week in Year 4 has been wonderful! Children interacted and collaborated in teams to create number lines in the Primary hall whilst challenging themselves to order and estimate 4-digit numbers. In English, our wonderful poets have created a setting poem to express their thoughts on our oceans. We got very messy and creative in Art by learning the skills we need to create clay pots. WOW! What a week!

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It has been a fantastic week in Year 5. We have persevered with our writing to improve our character descriptions and our cursive handwriting. In Science, we have learnt all about gravity on Earth and the Moon! In Maths, we have been busy comparing, ordering and rounding numbers. Next week, we will conclude Place Value and move onto Addition and Subtraction. Not forgetting, in History, we learnt about the Space Race!



Another superb week in Year 6 this week! We explored rules of divisibility in Maths and participated in practical approaches to identifying prime numbers. In English, we determined our key features of a diary entry for our toolkit and highlighted examples of these in our Example Text. We also experimented with wax crayons and watercolour paints in our Art unit inspired by Henry Moore. Well done Year 6!

Year 3: Has been learning to write a basic description about the family members.


Year 4: Has been learn and write the numbers to 200
