PRESCHOOL

The Preschool classes took a swoop into the woods for the Owl Babies by Martin Waddell. We used most of our senses to create little nests from various materials, then created little Owl Babies from play dough and enjoyed being creative with our colouring skills. Our fine motor skills are excellent! Hoo-h'HOO-hoo-hoo... We continued exploring the idea of 'same' and 'different' in math and investigated different sounds we could hear during our phonics lesson.



It has been a fantastic week in Reception. We have been learning our new sounds 'i' and 'n' and our tricky word 'me'. In maths, we've also been learning about making 123 and circles and triangles! We went on a shape hunt around the school and found so many circles and triangles! We learnt all about colour mixing too. Miss Kong and Miss Niculae are so proud of us for being little scientists this week as we investigated how Elmer's multi-coloured patchwork came about!

We took our maths lessons outside the classroom, making our very own number lines to 10! In English, we have explored conjunctions and sentence starters - our writing has been very descriptive! In Maths, we have been making connections between number patterns. A super week!



It has been a brilliant week in Year 3! In Maths we have completed Place Value and we are excited to start our new topic next week! In science we have been learning about movement and we created our own muscles using card and split pins! In English we have explored our example text and we have been introduced to fronted adverbials and rhetorical questions! A great week of learning well done!

In Science, we classified animals using scientific questions to help place them on a classification key. Year 1: Has been learning the numbers to 10 Year 2: Has been learning the numbers to 31. Year 3: Has been learning the colours according to gender and numbers..


Year 4: Has been learning the members of the family + verb "Tener"
