#### WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

## PRESCHOOL

In Preschool this week, we worked very hard building our fingers and hand muscles. We made finger movements while singing the nursery rhyme Incy Wincy Spider. We challenged each other to see who could catch two spiders by using tweezers. In Phonics, we continued to practise recognising rhyming words, and in Maths, we learnt how to subitise two. Our favourite part of the week was listening to the story The Very Busy Spider and making a spider using paint, googly eyes and construction paper.



What a fabulous week in Reception! We've learnt new sounds "f/ff" "I/II" and "ss" this week. In literacy, we learnt all about describing our favourite sea creatures! In maths, we learnt about capacity using vocabulary "full, nearly full, half full, nearly empty, empty". We had so much fun in our water tray and learning to share and take turns whilst playing with our friends.

## Year 1

Our little Bats and Butterflies have had a wonderful week! We have been developing our confidence by practicing our singing and dancing for our primary production ... how exciting? In English, we began to plan for our superhero narrative, applying all our new knowledge of repeated language, proper nouns and time conjunctions. We also continued to strengthen our subtraction skills in math by creating first, then and now stories and physically crossing out to take away! Finally, our budding scientists used a new scientific tool 'magnifying glasses' to closely examine and compare different types of rocks and their properties.



It has been a fantastic week for Year Two and we have absorbed lots of interesting learning! In English, we have explored a range of writing techniques such as the use of similes, speech and expanded noun phrases to add depth to our writing. In Maths, we have learnt more about 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. We were particularly excited about Art because we got to paint our Henri Rousseau inspired jungle landscape, we had so much fun!



Year 3 have been amazing this week! We have powered through assessment week and continued to practice our song for the school production! This week in year 3 we have started our new topic in maths and we are learning all about multiplication! In English we have explored how to use conjunctions in sentences to improve our writing. In Geography we had a exciting time drawing our own volcanoes! Finally, in Science we have continued to explore rocks and the differences and similarities between them!





What an incredible week with Otterguars! We have learnt incredible new songs to help us remember our times tables and help apply our knowledge to a variety of calculations. In English, we have been looking at the tragic ending of Snow White who dies when she eats the poisoned apple! In Guided Reading, we have been left on many cliffhangers to see what happens to Chaya and her friends in the Girl Who Stole An Elephant.



#### **Primary Weekly Brief**

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This week, we have completed our Autumn assessments. Please ask your child to tell you about their results. In Maths, we have been learning about equivalent fractions. Next week, we will practise converting improper and mixed fractions. In English, we have practised writing expanded noun phrases. In DT, we have introduced our new topic, which will involve creating our very own space mission patches!



We've been hard at work this week completing our Autumn assessments. Our fractions topic concluded with finding fractions of amounts and finding the whole from a fraction. We began our new topic on converting units, too! In English, we began writing our "warm" hot write on a flashback narrative, making use of figurative language and punctuation such as ellipses to show a change in time. Great work!



Year 1: Has been learning to say what they have in their classroom according to singular and plural.

Year 2: Has been learning about the family members.

Year 3: Has been learning the months of the year, the days of the week and the seasons. Year 4: Has been learning to describe their classroom using defined and undefined articles.

Year 5: Has been learning about the relatives using the verb "Tener"

Year 6: Has been learning about the regular verbs ending in "AR"



This week Primary students have been playing body percussion beats, percussion instruments and ukulele. Also children have been focusing on the songs for the primary production of 'Cinderella and Rockerfella.'

They have improved in singing so much and ability to sing in harmony as a group. Some of the songs are even split into 2 parts, which sounds incredible.

## Champions!




