WHAT HAVE WE BEEN LEARNING THIS WEEK?

PRESCHOOL

This week, while reading The Gingerbread Man, we explored the feelings of the story's characters. In phonics, we learned the "n" sound and the words that begin with it. We recapped the numeral five and how to subitise five in different ways. Using different numicons to fill up Sammy the Snail's body was so much fun. We also had a go building our hand muscles and cutting out the gingerbread man. Please remember our Learning through Play workshop, which will take place on Tuesday.



It has been an adventurous week in Koala and Tiger class this week as we went on safari with Handa's Surprise. We met new animals such as an ostrich and an antelope. We have been learning how to describe fruits and animals with our 5 senses. In maths, we have revisited number composition, one more, one less and patterns. In phonics, we learnt the new sounds 'igh' 'oa' and tricky word 'we'.



What an amazing start to Spring 2! The Bats and Butterflies have been SO active in their learning this week. They have baked bread, burnt houses, had a visit from a wolf, and that's not all! In Maths, they have been using Numicon and outdoor number tracks to add/subtract. In English, they have explored noun phrases for the first time AND in Science, they planted their own flowers and veggies.



It has been a very rewarding and exciting week of learning for Year Two. In English, we have learnt about Kenning Poems and created our very own. In Maths, we have used our outstanding number knowledge to share two digit numbers. Furthermore, Year Two explored theo the largest rivers in the world and absorbed lots of information. We have thoroughly enjoyed all aspects of or learning this week.

Year 3 have been working hard on their big write for English and continuing on their chocolatey journey through reading Charlie and the chocolate factory and learning about the history of chocolate! This week in Year 5, in Maths we began looking at multiplying fractions and finding fractions of quantities. In English, we have immersed ourselves in our new vehicle text "The Promise". In Science, we used our data skills to chart and compare the gestation periods of mammals. In Foundation, we mapped the free and slave states of 1850s USA and plotted the Underground Railroad stations.



It's been a great week in Year 6! In Maths, our topic of Decimals recaps prior learning through the importance of place value and the decimal point as a placeholder. In English, our scavenger hunt gave us clues to our new Vehicle Text, The Origin of Species, which ties in with our Science focus on Charles Darwin and his theory of evolution. We also discovered the importance of Rosa Parks in Foundation!

Year 3: Has been learning about the weather.


Year 4: Has been learning to say places of work linked with professions.

This week Primary students have been playing music games, body percussion, drums, chime bars, ukulele and other percussion instruments. We are learning about musical notation and instruments of the orchestra (brass, percussion families), listening to the sound of the instruments and trying to understand the difference. Students have been practising singing different melodies with SolFa hand signs. We have also sung a variety of songs such as 'Hello Song', 'Three little birds', 'Good morning song', 'Viva La Vida'

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At DBS Wakra, we don't complicate our rules. In fact, we keep them simple by just having three. Your children may talk about RRS, which stands for Ready, Respectful, Safe. As a staff, we know that all behaviours fall under these categories. There are times when children will get these rules wrong, but we do not give punishments, we help children understand their mistake and how they can learn from it.

Below are some examples of RRS.

Ready

Children come to school on time, in the correct uniform, and with the correct equipment. Children line up quietly.

Children show they are ready to learn by sitting smartly and giving the teacher their full attention.

<u>Respectful</u>

Being kind to each other.

Looking after the school environment.

Saying 'please' and 'thank you.'

Managing emotions.

Showing respect to all adults.

<u>Safe</u>

Showing fantastic walking.

Keeping shoes on to play football.

Bringing the correct equipment to school.

Reporting broken equipment to an adult.
