### PRESCHOOL

The adventure time continued this week and the children all enjoyed exploring their imagination by drawing different items and things related to the story. Our Phonics was focused on the 'm' sound and all the words we can form using the beginning 'm' sound. During math the children looked at number 6, they loved Six Dinner Sid. Please be reminded of World Book day Thursday, our theme is Little Red Riding Hood!



Tigers and Koalas had a fantastic week! In Maths, we have learned about doubling and about odd and even. In Literacy we used our senses to describe a savannah setting. What would we hear? What would we see? How would we feel?

The highlight of our week has been the start of our drawing club, where we can let imagination flow through drawing and storytelling.

## Year 1

Our brilliant Bats and Butterflies have had another super busy yet fun filled week! In English, we have focused on verbs and embodied how the wild things moved! In maths, we have explored and represented many concepts including finding the difference and related fact families! In geography, we began on Safari to Kenya, independently using atlas' to locate this country! The high of our week was our Spring day in which we immersed ourselves into this new season through sensory tuff trays on life cycles, cherry blossom paintings, kitchen roll caterpillars and veggie-beast snacks!



Bears and Camels have had a fun and productive week of learning this week. We thoroughly enjoyed our educational trip to Qatar National Museum. We learnt lots about Qatari life in the past and present. In English, we enjoyed reading our new text, 'The King Who Banned The Dark,' and we used the torches to explore the darkness of our classrooms. In Maths, we have excelled our number knowledge to calculate multiplication and subtraction word problems.



Year 3 have been working hard and enjoying environmental week! They have created salads, made their own earth seeds as well as using Art to paint their own Earth! In Maths, we have continued to learn about fractions in creative ways and in reading we have been using our senses to imagine what Willy Wonka's invention would taste or smell like! Furthermore, we have started our new Non-fiction text in English, exploring all the natural wonders in the world! Finally, in Science, we have been learning all about Sun safety and light sources!





This week in Year 4 was full of fun! We learned about mixed numbers and improper fractions in math, and wrote emotional diary entries about moving away from home in English. In Foundation, we explored "Extreme Earth," from erupting volcanoes to powerful hurricanes, delving deep into the effects these phenomena have on our planet. It's been an exciting week, and we're proud of the progress the children are making in all areas.

Year 5 have had another fantastic week! In maths, we have been finding fractions of amounts. In English, we have been exploring the vocabulary of our new text and thinking about the impact of it on the reader. On Monday, Year 5 went on their trip to Baladna Park, where they got to learn about how we get milk in the shops and also got to see animals in the zoo.



Year 6 have worked hard at another busy week! In Foundation, we performed drama pieces outlining the key events of the Montgomery Bus Boycott. In Science, we explored the formation of fossils and matched these to the animal. We created our own animal descriptions in English, as well as a short dialogue piece between Darwin and Fitzroy to prepare for our discovery narratives.

Year 3: Has been learning about the character.


Year 4: Has been learning to talk about meals in Spanish.

# Information

As we approach the Holy Month of Ramadan, let me take this opportunity to wish all our school community a happy, healthy and successful Ramadan.

Timings of the school day will be released when we have received the information from our colleagues at the MOE.

#### **Fasting**

The guidance states that children are not required to fast until they reach the age of between 13-15 years old.

We do not expect children in EYFS or Key Stage 1 to be fasting and should continue to bring food and drink for the busy school day.

In Key Stage 2, we recognise that some children will be beginning their fasting journey, be trying to fast part-time or be intrigued by how the fasting process works. I would encourage these children to have water and a light snack available should they feel they need it. The children must continue to be on top form during this term, as every moment of school counts especially as towards the end of the year there will be exams and assessments.

I want to clarify that there is no pressure for children to fast, and there will be no stigma attached if children try to fast but cannot manage it. Please note that fasting children will not be excused from taking part in PE lessons.

Children who are fasting are allowed to bring activities (colouring, puzzles, books, board games) to during break times- although no electronic devices are allowed.

If your child is fasting, please inform the class teacher to avoid any confusion and allow us to make proper arrangements.








# **Primary Weekly Brief**Week Commencing the 25th February 2024





We have had two cases of head lice over the last few weeks, so we ask parents to be vigilant and check their children's hair.

When we are made aware of cases, our nursing team will conduct thorough checks of all the pupils in the same class, and parents will be informed if the head lice are spreading-thankfully, the cases have been isolated.


You can do things to prevent the spread of head lice, such as tying up long hair and talking to your children about not sharing hats, brushes, bobbles or headbands. This includes you as a family.
